New Rent Control Policies Expected

WASHINGTON — A prediction that congress will write a new formula for controlling rents, with provision for increases "where inequities exist," came yesterday from Rep. Wolcott (R-Mich.).

He also forecast that the new GOP dominated congress will continue government rent controls—at least until next July 1.

Wolcott is to become chairman of the House Banking Committee which handles price and rent control legislation.

His statement to reporters came shortly after OPA was represented by a high official as "strongly opposed" to a general increase in rent ceilings but favoring decontrol of transient hotel rents. This official said any flat percentage rise in rents will have to come from congress, if at all.

Wolcott is whipping into shape plans for a quick investigation of the housing program for veterans, which he has described as "outrageously bad."

Whether rent controls are extended beyond next June 30, he said depends largely on whether the housing shortage is relieved by new construction.

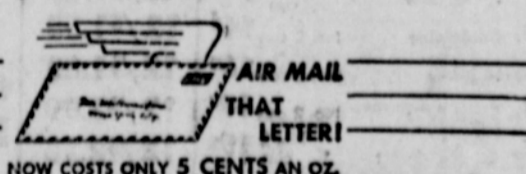

Dancing Schools Are Snares

For Gullible Writer States

Watch your step if you're planning to learn fancy stepping at some of the nation's dance schools.

Because if you don't you're liable to wind up paying more for proficiency in a slick samba or other tershichorean twists than you would for that smart 1946 convertible coupe the little woman wants.

With at least one lumbering male in every 100 attending schools where the latest dances are taught, Madame Lazonga's profession has definitely entered the realm of big business, with all the high pressure sales methods the term implies, according to an article in the November issue of Good Housekeeping magazine.

"This high-pressure routine is a direct outgrowth of the big-business status of many dance schools," the article states in part. "Operating with a tremendous overhead and enormous weekly payroll, the large-scale schools cannot afford to let a prospect slip off the hook without selling him almost everything but the wallpaper. Consequently, almost no holds are barred as the victim is cajoled, shamed and generally bludgeoned into signing for as expensive a course as his purse will permit and later into renewing for additional instruction."

"Highest paid of the front-office personnel in most dance establishments are the interviewers, who take newcomers in hand to discuss their dance needs. Steeped in salesmanship and psychology, they sell all that the traffic will bear, at the same time probing to find out what type of teacher the prospect would prefer."

45,000 Ore. Vets In College or in High School Now

Unofficial sources disclose that of the 140,000 veterans who served in the armed forces from Oregon during the recent war, 45,000 are either in college, high school or are receiving on the job training. Approximately 20,000 veterans have certificates of eligibility for college or high school training, but because of the crowded condition of both are not using the certificates at the present time. Of the above number 17,000 are estimated to be attending college.

Here there are about 25 veterans receiving on the job training, about 100 are attending college or high school, a few have secured G.I. loans to go into business, but the greater majority are employed in private industry.

Nation Is Facing Bad Coal Shortage

WASHINGTON — The nation came face-to-face with another crippling soft coal shortage today and the government girded for an attempt to punish silently-defiant John L. Lewis on contempt of court charges.

Lewis, who had served notice November 15 that his contract with the government would be void Wednesday midnight, let the deadline come and go without another word, although Federal Judge T. Alan Goldsborough had issued a restraining order calling on him to cancel the notice.

President Truman, vacationing at Key West, Florida, swiftly instructed Attorney General Tom C. Clark to press Thursday for a contempt citation against the United Mine Workers' chief—a citation which could mean jail or fine, or both.

Lewis Will Fight Charge
But there was little doubt that Lewis intended to fight the charge to the hilt, in an historic showdown between the government and one of the most powerful labor leaders in the world.

Under the procedure, as outlined by a high authority at Key West, a subordinate of Clark's will go into the federal district court here Thursday. He will argue that Lewis' silence amounts to a strike call—the miners do not work in the absence of a contract—and that therefore Lewis is in contempt of court.

Even before the midnight deadline, 140,000 of the 500,000 bituminous miners had quit work.

President Truman, it was stated, was not budging one inch from his determination to fight the strike every inch of the way.

Lewis' defense was not outlined in advance, but the CIO and AF of L, in rallying to his support, gave a hint of its possible nature. They called the restraining order illegal under the Norris-LaGuardia act, which curbed use of injunctions in labor disputes.

Lewis Retires at Home
Lewis himself was not available for comment on President Truman's signal for the great court battle. He had retired to his big white frame house in nearby Alexandria, Virginia. A reporter who knocked at the door was told by the houseman:

"Mr. Lewis is not to be disturbed."

Earlier Lewis had stalked away from his UMW headquarters in

Employment in Oregon at Peak

With covered employment in Oregon maintaining a record peace-time peak of about 275,000, payrolls for 1946 as reported by 14,000 employers are expected to fall but little short of the 1943-45 level of between seven and eight hundred millions. Although wages reported for the first half of 1946 reached only \$310 million, the rapid mid-year rises in employment, long summer harvests and other seasonal activities probably will bring the year's total within about 10 per cent of the \$704-million payrolls for the previous year.

Drop in shipbuilding wages from \$178 millions in 1945 to an estimated \$28 millions this year will be offset in large part by the following increases: Lumber and logging \$25 million; food process-

ing \$6 million; construction \$8 million; trade \$25 million; finance and realty \$5 million; service \$10 million; transportation and utilities \$10 million; agriculture, fishing, mining N. E. C. \$8 million; other manufacturing, \$20 millions.
