Taxpayers Near End of Honeymoon

Oregon taxpayers are near the end of their honeymoon and instead of coasting along with an income tax surplus, they will face a \$15,000,000 deficit for the 1947-49 biennium, State Budget Director George Aiken said Thursday night at Albany.

Speaking at a meeting of the Oregon Reclamation Congress, Aiken said state governmental costs have mounted steadily since 1941, listing state retirement fund demands among the most recent and decisive additions to tax requirements. It involves 7,000 state employees, he said.

"Something has to be done," Aiken declared. He suggested it might be necessary to call for a special election to permit revenue-seeking above the 6 per cent limitation.

On the brighter side, Aiken said Oregon has the lowest debt burden of any of the 11 western states and ranks third from the top in per capita income. It can thus well afford to shoulder the greater governmental load which has come with current price trends, he said.

The people, when the situation is known to them, "will willingly unite to carry on the work of their commonwealth," he concluded.

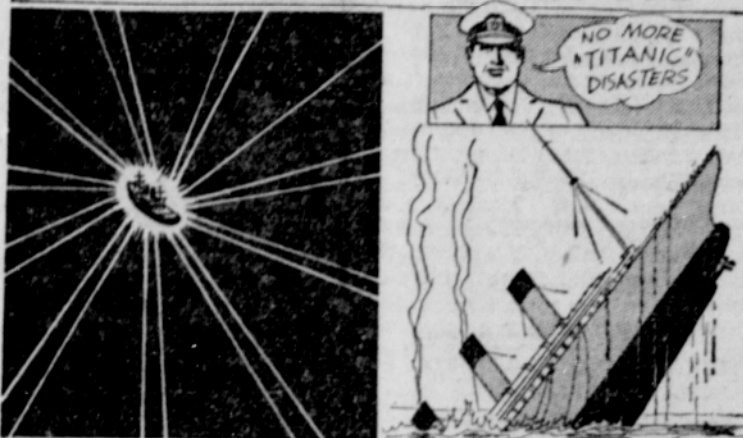
Makes Aerial Raids on Insects

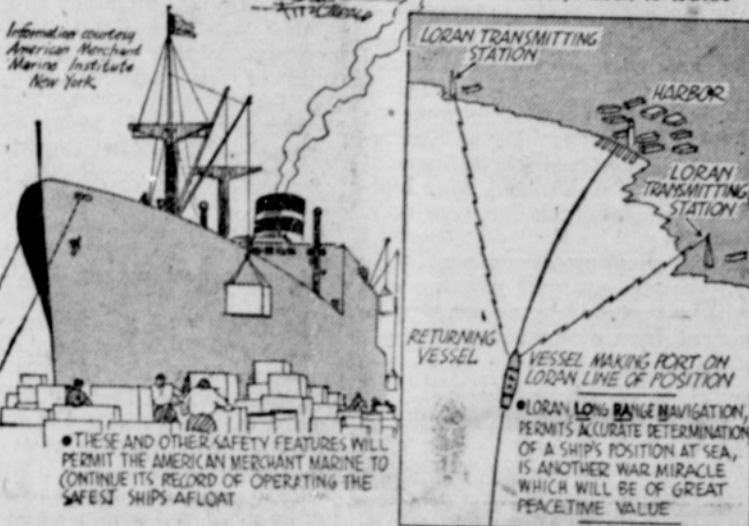

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Nut Growers Will Hold Meeting in Eugene Dec. 13-14

The Nut Growers Society of Oregon and Washington, formerly known as the Western Nut Growers Association, will hold its 32nd annual convention in Eugene, on Friday and Saturday, December 13th and 14th. With tremendous increase in filbert acreage during recent years, nut growing has become big business in Oregon and Washington, and this convention should be the most important in the history of the organization for growers of both filberts and walnuts. Emphasis and interest is added for filbert growers as a result of the present situation in relation to importations from the Mediterranean countries and the resultant price uncertainties.

The general purpose of the convention, as on all such previous occasions, is the development of the nut industry in Oregon and Washington in relation to the production of bigger and better crops, with greater efficiency of operation. Highlighting the convention will be reports and technical pictures covering the use of mechanical harvesters for filberts. Other subjects which will be covered include a report of the findings of the Nut Growers' tour made this summer, a report on results of fertilizer and boron trials, talks on soils and irrigation, diseases and pests, filberts as food, nut harvesting in general, and merchandising and marketing.

RETAIL PRICE OF BREAD ADVANCED

The Portland retail price of bread was up from 16 to 17 cents on a 1 1/2 pound loaf Tuesday. The increase had been expected since the larger loaf returned to the market recently. The one-pound loaf remained at 12 cents, although rye bread increased from 13 to 14 cents.
