NINE PEOPLE SOUGHT FOR VETS ADMINISTRATION

Qualified personnel are being sought for nine positions with the Veterans Administration in Portland and for three professional posts in the Roseburg VA hospital. Frank Sias, the agency's contact representative here, said today.

At Roseburg are needed an assistant laboratorian in bacteriology at \$2394 a year, an assistant utility officer earning \$3397.20 annually and a staff dietitian at \$2644.80 a year. The latter must meet American Dietetic association standards.

Portland facilities need two instructors in corrective physical rehabilitation and three physical therapists, all at \$2644.80 a year; three social workers at \$4149.60; a contact officer, real estate appraiser, medical rating specialist and four orthopedic mechanics, ranging from \$2644.80 to \$5905.

U.N. Facts and Faces CHINA



CHUNG KUO, or CHINA, first nation to sign the United Nations Charter, is a republic of nearly 4,000,000 square miles, with a population of more than 450,000,000. It lies in Southeast Asia, and borders on the Soviet Union, India, Burma, Indo-China, and the China and Yellow Seas. President is Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek; its capital, Nanking. China is a Permanent Member of the U.N. Security Council, a 3-year Member of the Economic and Social Council, and—like all U.N. Members—a Member of the General Assembly. Its Permanent Delegate at U.N. Headquarters is Dr. Quo Tai-chi, who sits on the Security Council. China's flag has a red field with a blue corner, showing a white, 12-rayed sun.

USSR



THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS is a Federal state of some 8,500,000 square miles—nearly one-sixth of the earth's surface on which a population of more than 193,000,000. USSR is in eastern Europe and in Asia, bordering on the Arctic Ocean, Finland, Poland, Rumania, Turkey, Iran, Afghanistan, China and the Pacific Ocean. The Soviet Union's Prime Minister is Josef Stalin; its capital, Moscow. USSR is a permanent member of the Security Council and a three-year member of the Economic and Social Council. Andrei A. Gromyko, USSR's permanent representative to U.N., sits on the Security Council. Her flag is red, inscribed with a gold hammer, sickle and star.
