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China Relief Campaign Opens

Portland — United Service to China opened its 1947 campaign in Oregon, whose people will be asked to subscribe \$80,475 on May 5 and will continue through the month. Slogan of the drive, whose origin is credited to Edward R. Stettinius Jr., national campaign chairman, is "Help China Help Herself."

Secretary of State George C. Marshall is national honorary chairman and Governor Earl Snell is honorary Oregon chairman. Francis Lambert, Portland, state campaign chairman, has announced appointment of F. R. Wilkinson of the First National Bank of Portland as state treasurer.

Ministers are taking an active part in organization of local committees in the major population centers. All Oregon communities will be given opportunity to learn of the necessity of American friendship for China and to share in the campaign through letters being sent to local leaders from state headquarters.

Of stimulating interest to campaign workers is the recent report of a survey made by the American Institute of Public Opinion (Gallup Poll) during March, indicating that 63 per cent of the people polled on national basis believe it "important" that Americans contribute money to help China get on her feet. Percentage of people favoring aid to China gained in March over December despite "unfavorable news of political happenings in the Orient."

Oakland Bank Is Robbed Monday of About \$30,000

The E. G. Young and Co. bank at Oakland was robbed of between \$30,000 and \$35,000 Monday morning, when two unidentified men wearing dark goggles entered the building and committed the robbery in western style. The robbery followed Oakland's two day celebration of its 100th anniversary. The five bank employees and two customers were forced to stand against a rear wall, while E. G. Young, manager, was made to surrender the bank's currency.

The two men made their escape in a dark sedan, which was abandoned a short distance north of Oakland. The bandits were believed to have switched to a waiting brown sedan. One bandit carried a revolver, while the other had what appeared to be an encased submachine gun. One robber was said to have been about 28 years old while the other was thought to have been about 35 years of age.

State police ordered all roads blocked in the hope of catching the bandits and local police joined in the search, but up to an early hour had not made any arrests. The FBI of Portland immediately joined the search, since the Oakland bank was a member of the federal reserve system.

The Oakland bank was the victim of another robbery on June 30, 1934 when Stanley C. Rayson of San Francisco held up the bank and was later caught on Rice Hill.

VETS MAY LOSE COMPENSATION

Several thousand Oregon veterans of World War II who suffered from malaria at time of discharge will lose their compensation for this disability unless they can present medical evidence to the Veterans Administration showing that the condition still exists. George E. Sandy, director of the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs, said today.

In a recent issue of the "Oregon Veterans News Letter," published by the state veterans' department, it was disclosed that recent VA regulations give the malaria victim only 60 days after notice of termination of his compensation to present medical evidence to show why his payments should continue. The veteran receives this notice one year after his discharge.
