against all of the taxable property within the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, for the purpose of deriving funds necessary to carry on the different departments and meet the expenses of the City Government of said city, and create sinking funds for the various outstanding bonds and obligations of the City; and

WHEREAS the levy within the constitutional limitation of Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, based upon the highest levy within the last three years plus six (6%) per cent, is \$27,565.01, which amount is not sufficient for rais-

ing funds necessary to carry on the different departments and meet the expenses of the City Government of said City and create sinking funds for the various outstanding bonds and obligations of said City, and the amount of tax necessary for said purpose in excess of the six (6%) per cent limitation proposed to be levied for said ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1947, to June 30, 1948, is \$6,990.48, not including the sum of \$6,035.61 to be raised by special levy of 5 mills, heretofore authorized by the voters of said City of Cottage Grove for sewers and drains, etc., and said 5 mill levy being outside of said six (6%) per cent limitation, and not including the sum of \$1,806.88 for bond and warrant interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. That the annual levy of taxes for the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1947, to June 30, 1948, be increased \$6,990.48 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, based upon the highest levy within the last three years, plus six (6%) per cent, amounting to \$27,565.01, and the said amount of \$6,990.48 being in excess of the six (6%) per cent limitation aforesaid, and being necessary in order to derive funds to carry on the different departments of said City and to meet the expenses of the Government of said City, caused by increased cost of labor and materials, and to provide further and additional funds for street and sewer construction and repairs.

The Armory, Lower Floor, A. F. & A. M. Building, corner H and Main Streets, in Cottage Grove, Oregon, in the First Ward; the City Recorder's Office, City Hall, on Sixth Street, between Main Street and Washington Avenue, in Cottage Grove, Oregon, in the Second Ward; and Pearl Safely residence, 1133 East Main Street, Cottage Grove, Oregon, in the Third Ward, are designated as polling places.
