JAYCEES IN COTTAGE GROVE

Two months ago Cottage Grove became the twenty-third community in Oregon to organize that livewire young men's group—the Jaycees, or Junior Chamber of Commerce. Today the roster includes over seventy names, with thirty-five active members who put over an eighteen-ton paper drive last month as the initial project.

Early in March a few enthusiastic veterans conceived the idea of Cottage Grove's need for this nation-wide, civic-conscious group, and went to the Eugene Jaycees for advice. The first meeting in Cottage Grove on March 13 created interest and a membership drive speedily went ahead. Plans are being laid for a charter dinner which officially will make the Cottage Grove Jaycees a member of the state and national organization. Jaycees from all over the state are expected to attend.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce in any city or town is a livewire group and none the less in Cottage Grove, "Ideas-Action," being the motto, the next project planned will be a boat race on August 18 at the Cottage Grove lake. Boat races will be featured, and a boat will be given away.

Proceeds from this and future projects will benefit the community. Other Oregon Jaycees have set the example with projects such as sports events, veterans' aid committees, fire prevention and traffic safety campaigns, youth welfare, air shows, public health drives, get-out-the-vote campaigns and tourist promotion.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce is a non-profit organization to build a better town and better men. It is not an exclusive group of big businessmen. It is a democratic organization run by its membership and may include any young man between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-five of reputable character and in good standing with the community. And the membership drive still is in full swing.

The local Jaycees also hope to organize the Jayettes, the women's auxiliary.

It may be summed up that the Jaycees have a four-fold program:

1. To make the community a better place to live in.
2. To develop leadership among its own members.
3. To offer education, recreation and social activities to youth of similar age.
4. To promote friendships.
