Henry George New Representative for Dept. Vets Affairs

With the recent addition of Henry George, former War Assets Administration employee, to the staff, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs now has three field representatives to assist county service officers and veterans' organizations throughout the state. Director George E. Sandy announced today.

Mr. George will cover northwestern Oregon from Portland to the Coast, and south to include Lincoln county and east to the mountains. He will work out of the Portland and Salem offices of the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

During the war Mr. George served with the 88th division infantry and suffered leg wounds in the Po valley drive in Italy which resulted in the loss of his left foot. After his discharge in May of 1946 he worked for one year as veterans' representative for War Assets Administration at Swan Island.

Under the new field setup Joe Reynolds will continue to cover the territory from Portland east to the Idaho state line and south to Deschutes county. His headquarters at present are Portland, but he will be stationed at Pendleton in the near future.

All southern Oregon, including Eugene on the north and Klamath Falls and Lakeview on the east will be served by Floyd Dover, whose territory formerly included that now handled by Henry George. It is expected that Mr. Dover will make his headquarters in Eugene soon, according to Sandy.

CIVIL SERVICE WORKERS NEEDED BY NAVY IN MARIANAS ISLANDS AREA

The Thirteenth Naval District has announced that civil, mechanical, electrical, and architectural engineers experienced in design, surveying, draftsmen, and trade and clerical personnel are urgently needed by the Navy for employment in the Marianas Islands area, including Guam and Saipan.

The salaries for the professional positions open range from \$5187 to \$6127 a year, and for sub-professional (Surveyors and Draftsmen) from \$3306 to \$3776 a year.

Applicants for the professional positions must have a college degree and have had approximately four years experience in engineering of a comprehensive technical and practical nature, involving structural and utility design.

Clerical personnel, Property and Supply clerks and Fiscal accountants, will receive a salary 25 percent above corresponding state-side rates.

Wages for trade personnel will be as follows: Carpenters \$1.72 an hour; refrigeration mechanics \$1.80 an hour; electrician linemen \$1.80 an hour; electrician cable splicer \$1.80 an hour; and auto mechanics \$1.72 an hour. The present administrative work week is 40 hours. Authorized work in excess of that will be compensated at overtime rates in accordance with regulations.

Applicants must sign a 12 month contract. Dependents cannot be taken to the islands. Housing and meals will be provided for employees at moderate cost. Transportation will be furnished and employees will be considered in a duty status during time of travel. Provision has been made for adequate medical care at all times. Recreation facilities in the area include such activities as movies, games, hobby shops, athletic events and swimming beaches.

In order to secure appointment applicants for professional or sub-professional positions must submit Form 57 "Application for Federal Employment" to the Office of Director of Pacific Division, Bureau of Yards & Docks, Federal Office Building, San Francisco, California. Applications may be obtained at any Post Office or Civil Service Office.

Applicants for trade and clerical positions are advised to write for further information to the Employment office, Mare Island Naval Shipyard, Vallejo, California.

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Oregon Blue Cross Offering Prepaid Medical Care

Cooperating with 30 Oregon participating hospitals and two in Clark County, Washington, Oregon Blue Cross, during June, will offer prepaid hospital, medical and surgical care on a nonprofit voluntary basis to self-employed persons or those working with less than five, according to Frank F. Dickson, executive director, Northwest Hospital Service.

"Oregon is one of the few Blue Cross Plans throughout the country to offer this type of direct enrollment," said Dickson. "Full family coverage for only a few cents a day is provided for such Blue Cross subscribers, either an eligible man or woman being permitted to enroll a wife or husband regardless of the spouse's place of employment as well as to enroll all unmarried children between the ages of 60 days and 19 years."

Direct enrollment at a slightly higher rate than that required of group members has been popular with small shop owners, farmers, professional persons and others working in establishments too small to form a group.

More than 27,000 persons including 70,000 Oregonians are currently enrolled in this nonprofit voluntary plan for prepaid hospital care, the daily roster of new members being more than 27,000.

THOUSANDS OF VETERANS QUALIFY FOR BONUS IN SEVEN STATES AND ALASKA

Thousands of veterans and relatives of deceased veterans of World War II, who, at time of entry into the service, were residents of Connecticut, Illinois, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont, or Alaska, but who presently live elsewhere, may qualify for payment under bonus laws enacted by these states.

For service information needed in filing applications, Navy veterans and their survivors now residing in the Thirteenth Naval District should write to the Thirteenth Naval District Civil Readjustment officer, 1800 Exchange Building, Seattle 4, Washington, or telephone SEEnac 4352, Ext. 542, 694, or 233, and not the Bureau of Naval Personnel.

Applicants under the Rhode Island bonus law must have their applications on file with the Rhode Island authorities on or before June 30 to be eligible for payment under the act.

Several other states have veterans' bonus laws pending.

Washington Letter

Recently I appeared before the House Committee on Public Lands to urge the passage of my bill, H. R. 2354. This bill, if passed, would have the result of opening up two and one-half million acres of O & C lands to mineral entry and exploration. The story back of this bill, which story also reveals the need of its passage, is briefly told. When the government recaptured the vast O & C land grant lands by the passage of the reversion act of 1916, it was obviously the intent of Congress that the reversioned lands should be subject to the same mineral and mining laws as are other lands in the public domain.

When the O & C Act of 1937, which provided for the administration of the O & C lands on a sustained yield basis, was passed, I do not think Congress intended to alter the status of the lands so far as minerals and mining were concerned. However, in 1940, the Comptroller General issued an opinion, later sustained by the mineral provisions of the 1916 act.

So, the situation now is that all mineral exploration and development on some two and a half million acres is prevented. It will be necessary for Congress to pass my bill, or an identical bill introduced in the Senate by Senator Guy Cordon, in order to unblock the present almost total restriction of the development of vast potential mining area in Western Oregon.

I have presented these facts to the committee and am hopeful that favorable action on the bill will be forthcoming.

As this is written, the House-Senate Conference Committee, which has been working out a compromise labor bill, has not yet made its report. I have received considerable mail on this subject and am glad to have the views of those who have written me. My intention regarding my vote on final consideration of the labor bill is to use my very best judgment. If, in my opinion, the conference bill is fair, reasonable and constructive so far as labor, management and the whole public is concerned, I shall vote for it. If I find, after careful consideration of it, that the bill is not a fair and reasonable and a desirable piece of legislation, I shall vote against it. I know of no other way to reach a decision on such hotly controversial legislation.

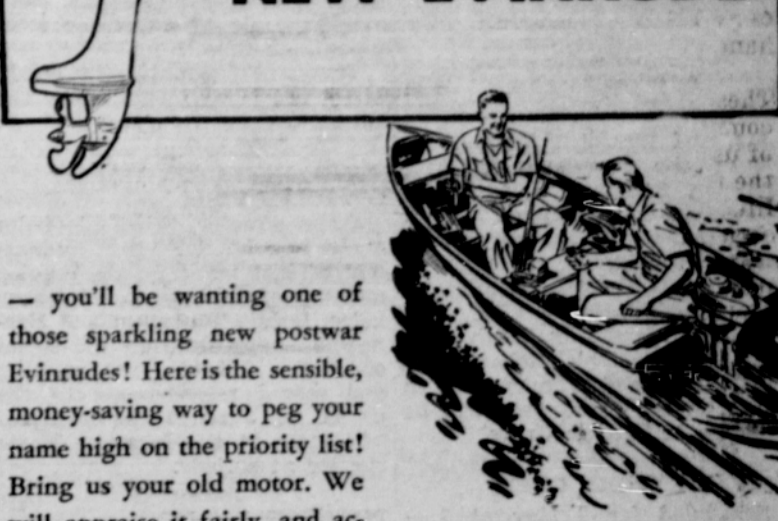
