Col. Frank L. Beadle, acting engineer for the Portland district, corps of engineers, announces that there were 196,019 visitors at the dam during the first six months of 1947. This is 37,383 more than for the same period in 1946 when 158,636 people viewed the huge power plant. This, he said, is an increase of 23.5 per cent for the six-month period.

Broken Driving Laws Figure in 90% Auto Mishaps

Broken driving laws figured in nearly 90 per cent of Oregon's 1946 car accident total, according to completed reports received by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrel Jr.

Only 6-810 reports out of the year's total of 61,305 reported smash-ups showed the drivers legally in the clear when final lists were in, once more marking carelessness or disregard of Oregon driving laws as a major factor in the state's accident toll.

One or more violations were noted in most of the remaining 54,495 reports, spotlighting the need for greater emphasis on voluntary observance of laws and stricter enforcement to check deliberate violations.

SEEK CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES FOR OVERSEAS POSTS

Men needed for civilian positions overseas in connection with the program for return and final burial of World War II dead are being recruited in this area it was announced today by Lt. Colonel Riley Kuehn, Commanding Officer of the Auburn General Depot.

A wide range of employment is being offered to qualified personnel who wish to take part in this program as members of one of the fourteen Field Operating Sections of the American Graves Registration Service which will tour the entire Pacific, Far Eastern and India-Burma areas. The Field Operating Sections will be organized and outfitted at Honolulu, Hawaii.

200 BILLETS OPEN FOR NAVAL RESERVE CRUISE TO JUNEAU

Only 200 billets are still available for Naval Reservists wishing to make a training cruise to Alaska aboard three destroyers, the Thirteenth naval District announced today.

The Destroyers—USS Lofberg (DD-759), USS John W. Thompson (DD-760), and USS John A. Bole (DD-755)—will leave Seattle on July 27 and return August 10, according to Capt. A. D. Ayrault, USN, District Director of Naval Reserves.

All hands will be granted two days liberty at Juneau, Alaska, during the four-day stay, July 31-August 4. This is the last reserve training cruise scheduled to an Alaskan port during the current calendar year.

Retired Bishop To Succeed the Late Bruce Baxter

The appointment of Bishop Francis J. McConnell, retired bishop of the New York area, as successor to the late Bruce R. Baxter, bishop of Methodist churches in the Pacific northwest, was announced Friday.

The college of Methodist bishops of the western jurisdiction announced the appointment, which will continue until July, 1948. At that time the western jurisdictional conference will elect bishops and make a permanent appointment.

Bishop McConnell, who had retired in 1944, was formerly president of De Paul university, supervisor of the Pittsburgh, Denver and New York areas of the church and president of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ.

He will supervise the Portland area, which includes 570 churches in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Alaska.
