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New Law on U. S. Navy Nurse Corps Clarified Recently

The effect of a new law covering admission to the Navy Nurse Corps was explained by Rear Admiral John Harper, medical officer for the Thirteenth Naval District. The feature of the bill which is of immediate interest to registering nurses who may be contemplating entering the Navy is that a professional examination will be required after November first, this year. Women applying before that date will not be required to take these tests and are subject only to the basic prerequisites of the Corps. These rules set age limits of 21-28 years and require the applicants to be unmarried citizens of general good health.

Officers of the Corps have authority in medical and sanitary matters in Naval Hospitals and Medical Department activities.

Four farm buildings are destroyed by fire every hour, according to National Fire Protection association.

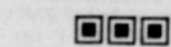
