The drive for ever-increasing wages, without compensatory increases in production, is a tragic example of economic futility.

A pietogram in the United States News vividly demonstrates what has happened to the American dollar.

This is not, of course, entirely the result of increased wages. Many other factors, notably taxation and prodigal spending, must bear their share of responsibility.

In the past, we raised wages and lowered prices. We accomplished that because output per man increased along with pay.

The real interest of labor lies in job security—and in the purchasing power of the dollar.
