The Northwest Public Power association created the Milton Hunt McGuire annual award for engineering achievement and awarded it to Hugh P. Currin, chief consulting engineer for the Eugene, Ore., water board, at the opening meeting of the annual convention here Thursday.

The award is named in honor of McGuire, who has been superintendent of the McMinnville, Ore., lighting department for the last 25 years. He also is vice president of the association. The plaque was

presented to Currin by John S. Dickson of Cathlamet, association president. It will be presented annually to an engineer who is most distinguished during the year for originality and efforts to increase the efficiency of his organization.
