New Timber Tax Now Being Paid

The first tax payments required by the State Forest Research and Experimental Tax Act are being received now at the Salem offices of the State Tax Commission.

This is a new tax enacted by the last session of the legislature as Chapter 544, Oregon Laws, 1947. It provides for a tax of 5 cents per thousand board feet on all logs, poles, piling, cordwood, pulpwood and other forest products harvested within the States of Oregon by lumber companies, logging operators, farmers or any

others, for commercial purposes. Revenue from the tax bill will be deposited to the credit of the State Forest Research and Experimental fund. Forty percent of the money deposited in such fund will be available to the State Board of Forestry for experiment and research and sixty percent of the money in such fund will be available to the forest products laboratory in Corvallis, Oregon, for research in the utilization of wood waste.

Tax returns should be filed by each person owning timber which is being harvested. The Commission's instructions state that the timber owner is that person either

owning such timber outright or buying it on contract at the time of harvesting.

4-Car Collision At Salem Result Of Heart Attack

Death of Jay J. David, 60, of Salem, from a heart attack while driving his car on Highway 99E one mile north of Salem resulted in a four-car collision at Salem Friday afternoon, Marion County Deputy Coroner Virgil T. Golden reported Friday night.

As David slumped in his seat, his car turned into the opposite lane of traffic sideswiping and completely spinning around an auto driven by Robert C. Arnold of Lebanon. Arnold's car was forced into the left-hand lane where it was struck by a truck driven by L. L. Winner of Albany and a car operated by William Lane of Chemawa, Golden said.

None of the three other drivers was injured in the collision, which took place in a rainstorm of cloud-burst proportions.

David is survived by the widow, a son and a daughter.
