NEW YORK PAYS HOMAGE TO NATION'S WAR DEAD



AS THE CASKET OF A CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR WINNER, representative of all his fallen mates, is carried to the ceremonial platform in New York's Central Park, men, women and children weep unreservedly. About 400,000 New Yorkers watched a caisson, bearing the body of a symbolic soldier, move through the city's streets to muffled drum beats and slow marches. At the memorial service in Central Park, attended by 150,000 persons, chaplains of three faiths prayed for the 6,248 soldier war dead brought from the European Theater in the hold of the Army transport Joseph V. Connolly.

Gold Into Mercury

Ancient alchemists dreamed and worked for means of turning quicksilver into gold. Now in atomic ovens, gold is being turned into mercury, a reversal of those ancient dreams. This standard is worth more than gold, says David E. Lillenthal, chairman of the atomic energy commission.

23,602 People Are Drawing Monthly Social Benefits

"Monthly benefits totaling \$463,766 were paid to 23,602 residents of Oregon in Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance payments in the month of June," Carl D. Monroe, manager of the Eugene Social Security Administration field office announced today. In Lane county there were in June 1,255 beneficiaries who received a total of \$24,477.

Although 2,827 residents of the five counties (Lane, Coos, Curry, Douglas, and Josephine) served by Monroe's office are drawing \$50-599 monthly, he is concerned over the fact that many others are losing benefits because they failed to file a claim for them. He emphasized the fact that payments under federal old-age and survivors insurance are not automatic. A claim must be filed with the Social Security Administration before a payment can be made.

With the United States well into the reconversion period, the Social Security Administration has not experienced as great an upswing in the number of claims filed as some people had predicted for the period when the high employment of the war years began to drop off. Monroe pointed out, however, that there are many people who would be drawing old-age and survivors insurance payments if they realized that they were eligible. His belief is borne out by the fact that a substantial number of the people who do file a claim find that they have lost at least one month's check by not filing promptly.

For the nation as a whole in the month of June the Treasury Department paid out \$35,071,472 in monthly benefits under this program. Monroe explained that this total was the amount actually paid during June. Many others have filed claims and would be receiving monthly payments if they were not earning more than \$14.99 a month at jobs in commerce or industry.

Cadiz Held Treasures

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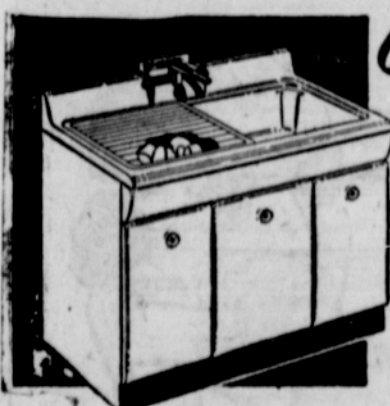


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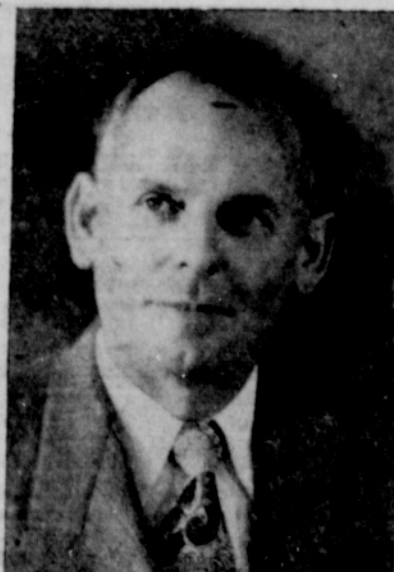
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
