

More Corn Profits
Sweet corn growers in New Jersey increased their profits per acre \$100 to \$150 by using ryania dust for the European corn borer. Experiments of the New Jersey station had proved its value against this insect pest. More than 40 tons of this dust, obtained by grinding the dried wood of a tropical plant, *Ryania speciosa*, were sold in the state during 1946, principally for use of sweet corn.

English Sparrow Imported
The English sparrow is really a weaver finch and is not closely related to any of the true sparrows of America. The English sparrow is a grain eater, not an insect eater. Sparrows were imported to Brooklyn in 1850 by Nicholas Pike, who believed they would kill the enter pillars which were destroying New York shade trees, but it was soon found that they were of no value in this regard.

Two Billion Egg Loss
Five per cent of the eggs produced in the United States, or two billion eggs, annually are smashed, cracked or otherwise damaged between the time they leave the farm and reach the breakfast table. This means a loss to both farmers and dealers and ultimately higher prices to the consumers. The U. S. department of agriculture has set up a research project in order to develop a new type of case or crate that will cut down handling losses. The study also will cover types of flats and fillers for egg cases as well as railroad handling methods. It has been estimated that if all egg loss could be prevented the consumer would secure his eggs at least five cents a dozen cheaper than he does now due to loss in transit.
