New Zealand's government is noted for its broad programs of social welfare for her 1,700,000 people. Her representative at U.N. Headquarters is Sir Carl A. Berendsen. The New Zealand flag is blue with four red stars and, in the left upper corner, is the Union Jack.

Among the details important to the lifetime enjoyment of a house is good plumbing and heating equipment. Quality materials and good workmanship are cheaper in the long run and are the best assurance of low maintenance cost during the life of the house.

The difference between a quality installation and a skimmed installation is in the materials, in the experience of the contractor who takes the responsibility for the entire installation, and the skill of the journeymen employed by the contractor who makes the installation.

A quality plumbing installation has piping of adequate size to deliver the proper quantity of water at all fixtures, irrespective of the demands for water made in the building.

Strait of Dover Still Proves Swimmer's Skill

Challenge springs eternal at the English channel's Strait of Dover, recently conquered by a swimmer for the first time since 1899.

The challenge is found not only in the channel waters, but also in the air above and even in the earth under the strait, notes National Geographic society. A land bridge joined the British Isles and the continent of Europe until worn away in the Ice Age perhaps 10,000 years ago, geologists believe.

In the realm of swimming, the treacherous 20-mile strait has been successfully negotiated 25 times. Ten women share the honor with 14 men, one of the men having crossed once in each direction. The first swimmer crossed in 1875.

Where the swirling stream of the North sea meets the ebb and flow of the channel, cross currents, double tides and whirlpools are created. Slack tide is unknown; gales, fog and rough water prevail much of the year.

Men in ships have challenged the channel, in peace and in war, for centuries. Romans and Normans invaded Britain from the continent, while Spaniards, Germans and others were thwarted.
