NEW YORK BLIZZARD TURNS QUONSET INTO IGLOO



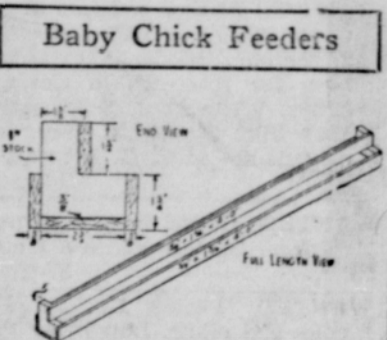
HOW A QUONSET HUT can be converted into a metropolitan igloo is demonstrated in the above picture, which shows Harry Feigenbaum sledding his son over a snow drift just outside his front door in the Bronx, New York. Built on the semi-circular pattern of Eskimo homes, the Quonsets proved snug dwellings when a 23.8-inch snowfall broke all New York records, temporarily crippling the city. (International)

Herds and Flocks on Successful Farms
 Feed bunks for cattle should be 30 inches high for mature stock and 24 inches for calves. Allow 30 inches of trough length for each grown animal, 20 for each calf. Make the grain and silage bunk three feet wide for feeding from both sides. Many ewes die every winter from a condition known as pregnancy diseases. The losses are not as common in flocks where the ewes are kept gaining slightly in weight during the gestation period.



Well-conditioned ewe that should cause no trouble.

Lousy cows, when freed from lice, give 10 per cent to 15 per cent more milk, according to Michigan State college. This means the equivalent of another cow in a herd for \$1, by controlling lice. In winter, which is a bad time for cattle lice, apply a powdered louse killer containing DDT and repeat the application in 10 to 14 days. Early spring litters of pigs do poorly unless the brood sow has an abundant supply of milk at farrowing time.



Baby Chick Feeders
 Preventing waste of feed is always important. Easily-built feeders of wood will help prevent waste of feed. This Washington State college design can be built at little cost. It will serve 100 chicks for their first 10 days.

New Poison Reported More Potent Than DDT
 An insect poison four times as potent as DDT against certain insects has been discovered. Called synkor, it is particularly powerful against such household pests as roaches, ants, moths and carpet beetles. Hordes of grasshoppers in recent years also have owed to this new chemical. It has proven effective for hard-to-kill German roach as well as weevils, aphids, lice and ticks.

Star Spangled Banner
 The original title of the Star Spangled Banner was "The Defense of Fort M'Henry." It was written in 1814 by Francis Scott Key, a lawyer of Frederick, Md., who as a visitor on board a British vessel in Baltimore had witnessed the British bombardment of Fort M'Henry. The words, sung to the air of "Anacreon in Heaven," at once gained popularity as a national lyric. It was not officially made the national anthem until more than 100 years after it was written. On March 3, 1931, approval was given an act designated "the composition consisting of the words and music known as 'The Star Spangled Banner' as the national anthem of the United States of America." When the national anthem is played, all those present should stand and face toward the music; civilian men should stand at attention, removing their hats. Men in uniform should salute at the first note of the anthem, retaining this position until the last note is sounded.

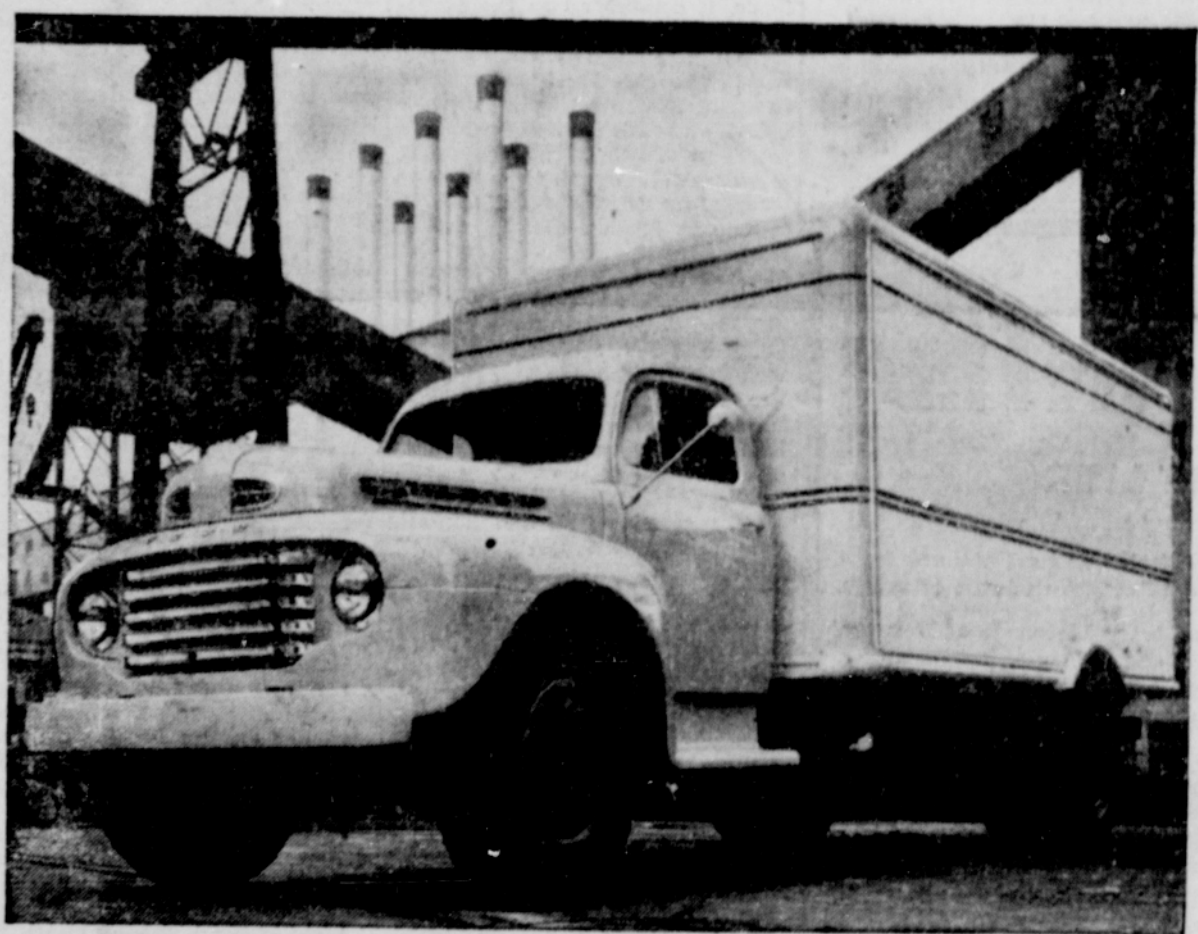
A new transformer was put in on Tuesday on the Chrisman place by the R. E. A. to better facilitate the many places which get electricity from it.
