Almond Hulls for Cows
To determine the value of dried almond hulls as feed for dairy cows, tests are being conducted at the University of California. Early tests showed that although hogs refuse to eat almond hulls they are eaten readily by dairy cows.

Few Changes Made In Angling Rules

The final angling regulations for 1948 were adopted January 26 by the Oregon State Game Commission after reconvening its hearing from earlier in the month when tentative regulations were formulated.

The order proposing to limit attractor blades to one on a line and the number of hooks to one set was not adopted, and the regulation will remain the same as last year.

Trout season and bag limits in general will remain as originally announced. The general season will be May 1 to September 30 in the state with the exception that the season for coastal streams will be from May 1 to October 31 above tide water and from June 15 to October 31 in tidewater. Minimum length limit for trout will be eight inches in the coastal waters and six inches in the rest of the state.

The season for salmon and steelhead over 20 inches will be the entire year for the state except that coastal streams and tributaries of the Columbia River below the city limits of St. Helens will be closed during March and April. The Wilson, Trask and Nehalem rivers will be closed to all salmon fishing from March 1 to September 15, while the Miami river will be closed to all fishing during the month of November. There will be no open season in the winter for steelhead in the Willamette river and its tributaries above Oregon City Falls except the Santiam river and its north and south forks. The bag limit for salmon and steelhead over 20 inches will be 2 a day or 4 in any 7 consecutive days or in possession, but not more than 20 during any one year.

The jack salmon bag limit will be 10 fish a day but not more than 20 in possession at any one time; provided that during the open trout season the bag limit for jack salmon is to be counted in and as part of the general trout bag limit.

Last year's closure of certain coastal tributaries will remain in effect this year, instead of being opened for summer trout fishing as tentatively proposed.

The regulation proposing to close boat fishing in the Tillamook county streams above the head of tidewater was rescinded and will not be in effect.

A few changes in county regulations from those announced two weeks ago also were made. The complete regulations for each county, including the regulations left unchanged and the new ones will be included in the annual angling synopsis which will be available sometime after March 1.

Reedsport Man Drowns in Umpqua River Saturday

K. J. McGuire, 51, of Reedsport, was drowned in the Umpqua river about 13 miles east of Reedsport Saturday afternoon about 4:00 p.m. when his car left the highway and plunged into the river. The accident happened while McGuire was enroute to Salem. State police report that the car driven by McGuire apparently went out of control about 200 feet from the point where it plunged into the river. There was no evidence of a collision.

His body was recovered by county officers early Saturday evening.

Pleased to tell you House of Representatives today passed identical bill containing provisions of my bill providing for increase in subsistence allowance to veterans attending school which I succeeded in getting through Senate last July. House action today results in this legislation going to White House for presidential action. This veterans legislation is one of my major legislative proposals, as chairman of subcommittee on veterans affairs, and naturally I am pleased that we have finally succeeded in getting it through both houses of Congress. House also today passed bill on subject of on-the-job ceilings, which is somewhat different from my bill on same subject which passed Senate last July. City Builders Are Lax in Submitting Building Plans

Builders have been lax in submitting plans for remodeling or reconstructing new buildings in compliance with the uniform building code, Charles E. Miller, city inspector, has reported.

"When remodeling affects the structural strength of the building, plans of anticipated changes must be submitted to the city engineer," Miller said. "And on all new buildings, plans must conform to the specifications—lot and building sketched to scale showing the place of the building on the lot, distances from lot lines, sidewalk lines and alley lines, with the size of the building as well as elevation."

Cottage Grove adopted a code 20 years ago and the city council passed an amendment in 1946 adopting that year's edition of the Uniform Building Code.

The code calls for plans and specifications drawn to scale upon "substantial cloth and of sufficient clarity." It also specifies that work requiring a permit shall not be commenced until an inspection record card is posted on the front premises.

Inspections to be made by the city inspector include: 1. Foundation inspection after trenches are excavated and forms erected. 2. Frame inspection after the roof, all framing, fire-blocking and bracing is in place and all pipes, chimneys and vents are complete. At this time electrical and plumbing inspections also should be requested. 3. Lath inspection, after all lathing, interior and exterior, is in place and all plastering materials are delivered on the job. 4. Final inspection after building is complete.

Referring to the location of the building on the lot, the code states, "Any exterior wall having windows or other openings shall be at least three feet from the lot line. Walls less than three feet from the lot line shall be without openings and shall be of one-hour fire-resistive construction."

"One-hour fire-resistive construction consists of exterior plaster over metal or wire lath on the outside and interior plaster over metal or wire lath of three-eighths inch perforated gypsum lath on the inside."

Mr. Miller also called attention to the sanitation section of the code that states, "Sanitation facilities shall be provided as required by the local health authorities. There shall be no opening from a room containing a water closet into a room where food is prepared or stored."

"Light, ventilation and sanitation shall be provided as specified by any state laws."

CUBS DEFEAT LATHAM

In the preliminary game the cub "B" squad, led by Curley Johnston, who chalked up 17 counters, trounced the Latham "B" squad 32 to 18.

The cubs play Roseburg at the high school gym Saturday night.

Need More Tests Before Parathion Endorsed by OSC

Parathion, the new trade name for an insecticide first known as AATP, may be as valuable as its sponsors claim in killing mites, aphids, codling moth and many other pests, but entomologists at the Oregon experiment station are not ready to recommend its use on other than an experimental basis until further tests have been carried out in this state.

In explaining this situation Dr. Don C. Mote, entomologist of the experiment station, says this material has been under test by experiment stations only one year and that it was so scarce last season that only a limited quantity was available for research on Oregon crop pests.

Because of the limited extent of the tests, only a meager amount of information has been obtained as to its possible injury to plants, its effect on humans and especially those who apply it on a large scale, its effect on beneficial insects including bees at various dilutions, as well as on game birds and other wildlife, and many other facts that are normally determined before a material can be safely recommended.

Greater quantities for research purposes are assured this season, hence extensive tests will be made on the pests for which it has been recommended as well as on pruned thrips, cherry fruit fly, filbert work and many others, Dr. Mote promises. As fast as reliable information is obtained on its advantages and limitations it will be released to the public, he says.

For the coming season, therefore, the standard recommendations of the station for control of mites on hops and tree fruits will be the various DN dusts, as well as dormant applications of lime sulfur or oil emulsion, while the codling moth control recommendation will be lead or calcium arsenate or DDT, depending on local conditions.

Parathion has shown so much promise in Washington in controlling both mites and codling moth when used alone or with DDT that some growers are reported impatient to use it commercially.

mercially. In the absence of federal tolerances as to spray residue, as well as other uncertainties, such use carries a considerable element of risk in Dr. Mote's opinion.

Blood to Fight Virus
The fat from blood may be used against infantile paralysis and other virus-caused diseases that attack the brain and nervous system. Work being conducted at Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research indicates that the fat soon may become a chemical weapon for this purpose.
