The Ashland five held the scoring advantage throughout the first half but turned in a bad third quarter and played on even terms in the final frame.

Ashland opened the scoring with a gift shot after one minute of play. A few seconds later Bissel canned the first field goal to jump Ashland to a 3-0 lead. Schaffer came back to open the Lions' scoring with a one pointer. A free throw by 6 ft. 5 in. Mayfield and baskets by Bissel and Kannasto

land closing the gap to three points in the final minutes of the game. Schaffer canned a gift shot with 10 seconds to go to round out the final score at 31-27.
