**Feb. Employment Shows Increase**

Employment in this area showed some increase during February according to a summary of the local labor market issued by the state employment office here. The summary follows:

Total employment in the Cottage Grove area showed some increase in February over the previous month. Employment in logging and lumbering, although still hampered somewhat in the higher levels by snow and rain, increased materially during the latter half of the month. The greatest change, however, was felt in the construction industry as contractors resumed hiring in the heavy construction fields. No shortage of labor in any classification developed nor is anticipated for several months.

**Unemployment**

Total unemployment continued to increase during the first and second weeks of February, as snow closed several logging operations. However, after this period warmer weather and the resumption of construction work rapidly reduced our unemployment load. By the end of the month we had 486 active applications on file; of this number 120 were women and 157 were veterans.

**Migration**

Migration into the area increased materially over the previous month. 52 persons were recorded by this office for the month. Of this number 7 who contacted this office were women and 20 were veterans. This figure does not include the number of "floaters", residents of Oregon who are moving from place to place in search of employment.

**Openings**

Job openings received in this office during last month totaled 96. 8 openings were carried over from the previous month. At the end of the month, 7 openings were carried over. 4 of these were filled by the first three days of the following month.

**Future Employment Trends**

Employment should show a material increase during the coming months, especially in the construction fields. However, any increase in the field of logging and lumbering is largely dependent upon the weather, and promises to be somewhat spotted over the following month.

**Housing**

Housing is scarce and promises to be even more so during the coming months. Rooms for single men are still available, the cost ranging from \$6.00 to \$11.50 per week.

**What is a Dairy Cow?**

The term dairy breed has been accepted by stockmen and investigators as referring to the breeds of cattle that are especially well fitted for production of milk and butterfat. Such breeds represent the efforts made by breeders of many generations toward improving the milking capacity of certain classes of cows. Because of this fact the inherent tendency of registered dairy cows to produce milk is greater than that of a native or unimproved cow. This inherent capacity is transmitted to the offspring.

**Value of Milk**

A quart of milk—four glasses—supplies approximately these percentages of the daily nutritive requirements of an average man: Calcium, 100 per cent plus; riboflavin (vitamin G), 82 per cent; phosphorus, 67 per cent; protein, 49 per cent; vitamin A, 30 per cent; thiamin, 22 per cent; calories, 22 per cent; vitamin C, 19 per cent; niacin, 6 per cent, and iron, 3 per cent.

**Statewide Game Census Completed**

The statewide upland game censuswork has been completed by the Game Commission field crew and a very satisfactory carryover of winter breeding stock has been noted. However, hunting conditions and regulations for the 1948 upland game seasons will be largely dependent upon the success of the spring brood survival.

All game farms are in readiness for the beginning of the 1948 pheasant rearing season. Rearing activities will be carried on for the first time this year at the new Hermiston game farm even though the physical development of the farm is not complete.

**Berry Growers Can Get Information On Strawberry Improvement Program**

Strawberry growers who expect to apply for inspection and certification of strawberry plants this year are invited to call at the county agent's office soon for circulars giving information on the strawberry plant improvement program and certification standards, states Assistant County Agent W. B. Parker.

The object of strawberry plant certification is to provide sources of strawberry plants that are true to name and that are practically free from diseases and insect pests. In 1947 nine Lane County farmers entered a total of 16.75 acres of strawberries for plant certification and the plants grown by four growers representing 9.25 acres were approved for certification.

There was a great demand for certified strawberry plants last fall and there has been this spring, says Parker. Growers have not been able to purchase nearly as many good plants as they desire.
