SDA Church to Have Offering for Czechoslovakia

Responding to calls from church leaders in Czechoslovakia, the Sabbath school members of the Seventh-day Adventist church will give a special offering Saturday, March 27, toward the building of a training school, and a publishing house in that country.

During the past quarter the superintendent, Mrs. H. C. Foos, has featured reports from Czechoslovakia revealing the fact that since the war the church has had no school in which to train its 2,000 youth for service. This, it is pointed out, is a great handicap in the development of future workers for the church.

Both of these institutions will now be provided by the worldwide Sabbath school plan for an overflow offering on the 13th Sabbath of the quarter. This will augment the regular Sabbath school offerings devoted to foreign missions, which average approximately a million dollars a quarter.

A 20 acre tract of land near Prague has been secured for the training school and the publishing house, according to reports received by the church. These also reveal that in this "land of John Huss" there are now more than 100 Adventist churches, with 4,000 members.

WHEREAS in Chapter XXVI Oregon Code 1930 and amendments thereto, it is declared to be the duty of every person, firm, co-partnership, company and corporation owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, place, building, structure, wharf, pier or docks which is infested with ground squirrels and other noxious rodents or predatory animals, or as soon as the presence of the same shall come to his, their or its knowledge, at once to proceed and to continue in good faith to exterminate and destroy such rodents by poisoning, trapping or other appropriate and effective means; and

WHEREAS gray digger ground squirrels (Citellus douglasii) are noxious rodents in Lane County, Oregon.

Now, therefore, all of such persons, firms, co-partnerships, corporations and companies owning or having dominion over land in said Lane County, Oregon, are hereby required to take steps to exterminate said gray digger ground squirrels (Citellus douglasii) within thirty days from the date of the first publication of this notice. If such steps are not taken, a person or persons appointed by the County Court of said Lane County will enter upon said lands and proceed to exterminate said gray digger ground squirrels (Citellus douglasii) and the cost of said extermination will be levied against said lands.

The County Agricultural Agent hereby designates Monday, April 5, as a day to be known as "squirrel poisoning day" throughout the said Lane County, and it is hereby recommended that poisoned barley prepared for the Lane County Agricultural Agent's office in accordance with U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service directions, be used for the purpose of such extermination. Such poisoned barley may be secured from the undersigned at his office in Eugene, Lane County, Oregon, at approximately the cost of preparation of same.
