

New Blackberry Is Released Lately

A new blackberry variety especially suited for freezing has been developed at the Oregon State college experiment station through a cooperative station USDA breeding project. It is recommended for trial planting in Oregon and Washington areas where blackberries are grown for the frozen pack industry.

Release of the new variety named Chehalis, has been announced jointly by R. S. Reese, acting station director, and Robert M. Saiter, chief of the USDA bureau of plant industry. It is described in station circular of information number 421, available on request from county agents or from the college.

A cross between the Santiam and the Himalaya, the Chehalis was developed by George F. Waldo, federal pomologist stationed at the college. Tests to determine the freezing, canning and preserving qualities of the berry were conducted by Thomas Onsdorff, associate food technologist.

Outstanding characteristics of the Chehalis is its bright, black glossy color, which is retained after both freezing and canning. The flavor, which resembles that of the native trailing berry, is also retained in the frozen pack but is partially lost in the canner product.

The new berry ripens from 5 to 15 days after the Boysen and almost to the beginning of the season for the Evergreen variety, thus filling a gap in present processing schedules. Berries are slightly smaller than Loganberries and are firm enough to keep shape after freezing.

Tests so far have shown that the berry grows well in the Willamette valley, particularly in the northern section. Its adaptability to other areas has not been definitely determined.

UN Contest Offers Opportunity to Observe UN Work

LAKE SUCCESS, New York—Would you like to spend a month studying the United Nations and have your expenses paid while doing it?

Ten people (outside of Canada and the United States, which are near) who answer yes to that question this spring will get their chance to observe U.N. here at the organization's headquarters as a result of a world-wide essay contest, set up by the Department of Public Information.

Each contestant must be a member of a non-governmental organization, such as a United Nations Association or similar group which cooperates with U.N. He must be between 20 and 30

years of age and must have some proficiency in either oral English or French.

Contest essays must be about 1200 words in length on "The Role of the Individual in the United Nations" and may be written in the contestant's language.

National committees will be organized to direct contests in countries served by the U.N. Information Centers in London, Paris, Copenhagen, Prague, Warsaw, Moscow, New Delhi, Shanghai, Rio de Janeiro and Mexico City. The centers will send one or two of the best essays of their areas to the U.N. headquarters by June 1 for the final judgement by an international jury. Ten winners will be selected by June 25.

The winning essayist will be given transportation between their homes and Lake Success and an allowance of \$10 per day for thirty days. The fellowship may be used any time between July 1 and December 31.

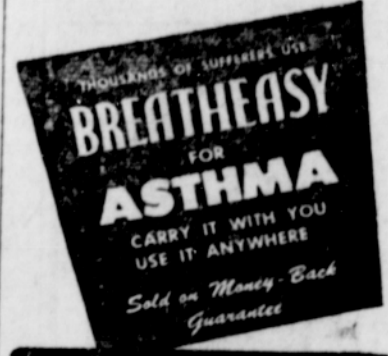
