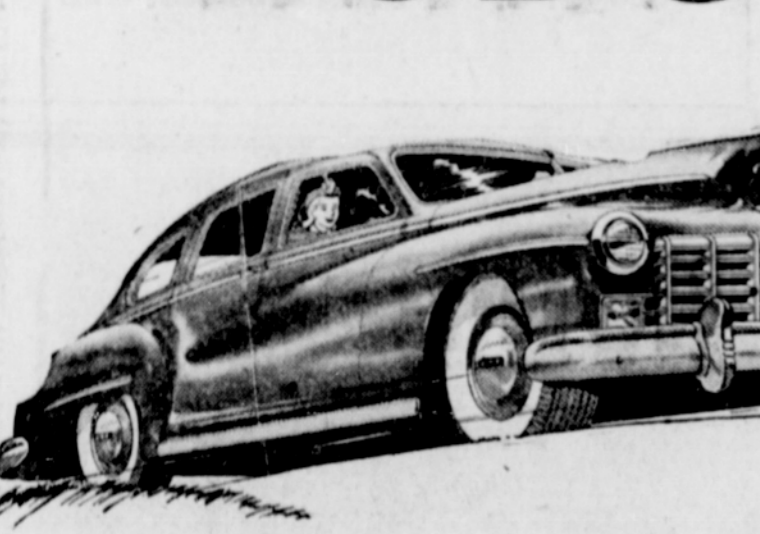

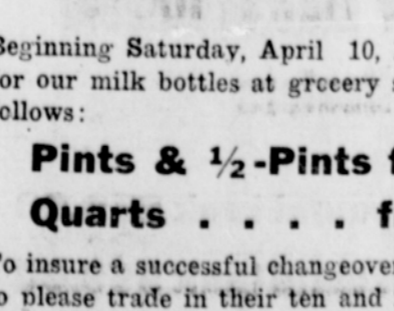

Quarts from 10c to 5c

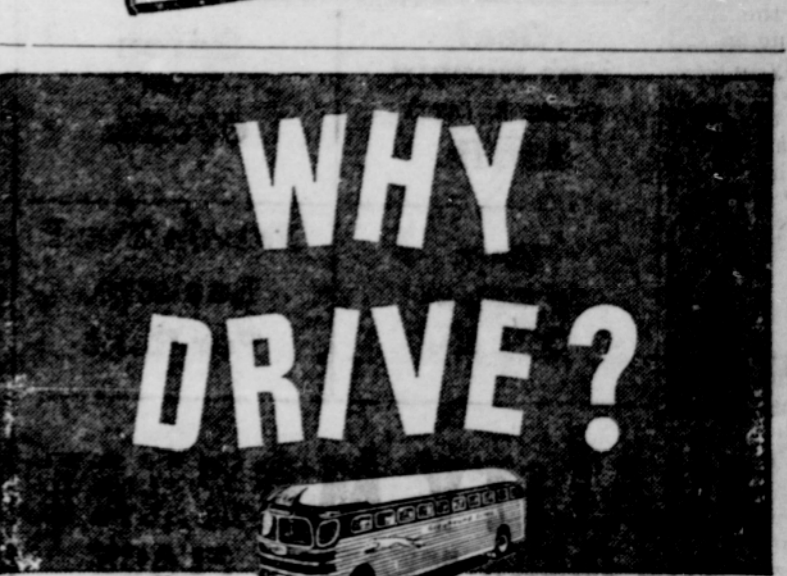
