The entire question of what action the United Nations Security Council will take in Palestine is being debated in a new atmosphere, following the United States' change of attitude on partition of the Holy Land. New discussions are centering around the United States' proposal for a new special session of the U.N. General Assembly to "consider further" the question of Palestine. Previously, the Council's debates had been based on the U. N. Palestine Commission's request for outside aid in enforcing the partition of the Holy Land into separate Jewish and Arab states as approved by a majority of the Assembly last fall.

Meanwhile, the Palestine Commission, under General Assembly instructions, is continuing to plan for partition. Among the Commission's plans are those for setting up a provisional government for the Jewish state and for a special police force for the City of Jerusalem.

In the field of atomic energy, further talks on the structure of a proposed international control commission for atomic operations have been dropped after the 11 nations on the Atomic Energy Commission's committee on controls failed to reach agreement.

Burma moved closer to membership in the United Nations when a Security Council committee unanimously approved its application for membership. Burma's application, submitted on 27 February, now awaits approval by the Security Council, which will report its recommendation to the General Assembly.

Employment Up Over District

A summary of the local employment outlook has been prepared by the state employment office at 39 South Sixth street and shows employment in the district increased considerably in March over the month of February.

The summary:
Employment and Shortages
Employment in the construction field got underway, and during the middle of March the work force in this field increased to more than double the number recorded at the end of February. The lumber industry was slow due to late snows which crept down from the higher levels until it stopped work in nearly all logging operations in the area. By the end of the month, warm rains and sunshine incited this off, and at the close of the month practically all operations, with the exception of on the higher levels, had resumed normal operations.

Some of the smaller seasonal mills opened operations at the close of the month, putting a few more men back to work.
Unemployment
In spite of increased hiring which has removed a large number of men from the labor market, unemployment remained practically unchanged, due largely to the heavy influx of job seekers into the area.

Migration
A total of 109 in-migrants contacted this office during the month of March. The greater share of these were unskilled workers, primarily interested in construction work.

Employment Outlook
Non-seasonal job openings on hand at the end of the month totaled 20. The majority of these were for skilled men in building construction and the lumber industry. Only 2 of these openings were for women. 208 job openings were received during the month, over twice the number received during February.

Future Employment Trends
Employment should increase rapidly over the coming month as more construction work and logging operations open. Very little increase is anticipated in the retail field, however.

Employment Hindrances
Unfavorable weather conditions, lack of transportation, and a definite shortage of family housing has definitely hindered the employment of some workers.

Increased Yields Noted With Use of Fertilizer

Wheat yields can be stepped up 7 to 14 bushels per acre and the hay crop can be increased through use of more fertilizer in hay and pasture crops seeded in small grains, declares Dr. D. R. Dodd of the Ohio experiment station.

This practice is particularly profitable on land already highly productive, Dodd points out. As an example, he cites tests made by research men on plots at the Ohio station. The land's producing capacity already had been built up by good soil management so that it was producing an average of 85 bushels of corn, 23 bushels of wheat and 3 tons of hay per acre.

In the tests, a 2-12-6 fertilizer was applied at increasing rates to wheat.

Minnesota Starts Big Tree Planting Project

As the first step in a far-reaching tree planting program authorized by the state legislature last year, Minnesota is planting about two million trees this year.

A million deciduous and coniferous trees are being sold at cost plus handling expense for planting on private lands. Another million coniferous trees are available for free distribution for planting on public lands.

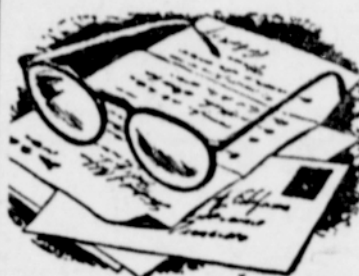
Washington Letter

In about two weeks, the Federal Highway Aid Act of 1948 may be acted upon by the House of Representatives. The bill which was reported to the House in the form of a "clean" bill is now designated as H. R. 5888. It authorizes appropriations for federal aid highways, and the authorization extends for the ensuing three fiscal years.

An important improvement in the road bill just reported is that it provides that a state may have three years after the close of the fiscal year for which the sums are authorized in which to complete construction contracts. Previously, the states were required to complete their expenditures within one year.

I believe most of the members of the House of Representatives who voted for the European Recovery bill were displeased with the plan, disliked the bill, and did not feel that the enormous expenditure authorized would accomplish the results claimed by the sponsors of the bill. Then why, under the circumstances, did they vote for it? There are many parts to a complete answer to that question, but the underlying fundamental reason is that the governments of Western Europe were assured months ago that Congress would approve the plan. They began counting definitely on it when the bill passed the Senate with only eleven dissenting votes. Had the House rejected the ERP at this critical time, the reaction not only in Europe but throughout the world would have been disastrous, and I mean ultimately disastrous to the United States. Furthermore, we had only the flat choice of doing this or nothing at all.
