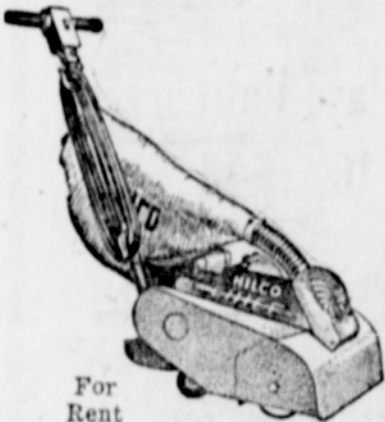

STASSEN LEADS IN WISCONSIN

Stassen led MacArthur 19-to-8 in late returns from Wisconsin's G. O. P. primary.

Almost complete returns indicated the former Minnesota governor definitely won 18 of the state's 27 delegates. MacArthur's forces won six delegates. Three were still to be decided, including one in which New York Governor Dewey stood an outside chance of landing one delegate.

Stassen's victory was largely unexpected, since MacArthur was regarded as a "favorite son" in Wisconsin. Dewey, who swept the Wisconsin primary in 1940 and 1944, said his "temporary setback" was more or less expected, and predicted a better showing in next Tuesday's seven-man Nebraska primary.

Observers speculated that MacArthur might withdraw from the presidential race because of his showing, such as Wendell Willkie did after the 1944 Wisconsin primary.

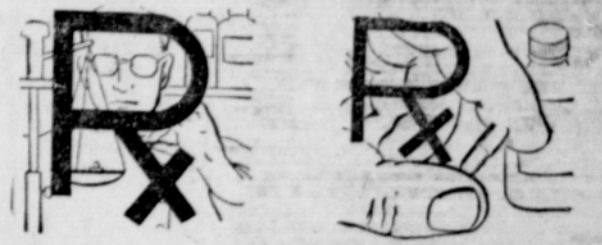

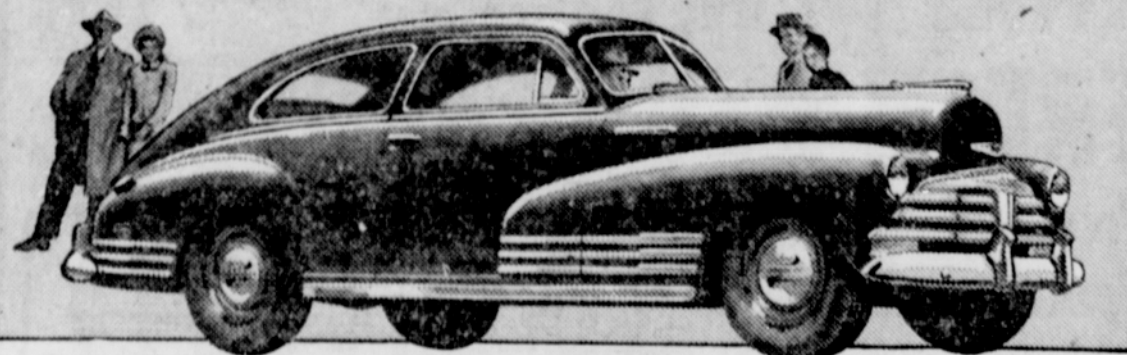

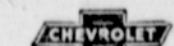
