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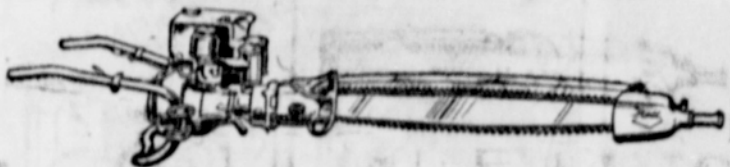
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**A FLYING MODEL

**Method Killing
Trees, Shrubs, Is
Told by O. S. C.**

While farmers and home owners are mostly concerned with how to make plants grow better, some are also interested in how to kill them, particularly undesirable trees and shrubs.

As an aid in such work the extension service at Oregon State college has just issued circular No. 507, "Methods of Killing Trees, Shrubs and Brush," by Virgil H. Freed, who heads weed control research for the experiment station.

In killing a tree by girdling Freed suggests shallow instead of deep cuts. A shallow girdled tree will live for a year but will sap the strength from the roots so sprouting is reduced. Deep girdling kills quickly but promotes sprouting.

The circular discusses poisoning with sodium arsenite, sodium chlorate, ammonium ulfimate and 2,4-D. The last is reported effective on alder, willow, poplar, cottonwood, box elder, dogwood, gooseberry and poison oak if properly applied. It will not control blackberries or maple and oak trees.

In using 2,4-D there is danger in using too strong a solution, Freed warns. When the proper strength is used the material is carried through the roots and kills the entire plant, while too strong a solution damages the top quickly while the roots remain relatively unaffected. **Bulletin Tells
Post Treatment**

Black locust farm plantings to supply future fence posts are proving a good investment on some farms as this species grows rapidly but produces a durable post even without treatment, according to information contained in a new bulletin, "Poles and Fence Posts for Oregon Farms," issued by the O.S.C. extension service. Authors are Dan D. Robinson, assistant professor of forest-

try, and Charles R. Ross, extension forester.

Of 22 black locust posts in a test setting near Corvallis, all are sound after 12 years in the ground, the authors state. The bulletin gives directions for all the common treatments for posts and discusses the characteristics of the

western woods used and how each may be handled for longest life. Copies of the bulletin are available free from any extension office.
