Distillers Triple Use of U. S. Grain

In the last year or so you have no doubt heard much argument as to how much grain the distillers use. Here is a press dispatch from Washington that should settle the argument. It shows that U. S. distillers tripled the use of grain after the controls went off. Whisky makers tripled their use of grain the first month after the end of federal controls, a Government report showed, Associated Press says.

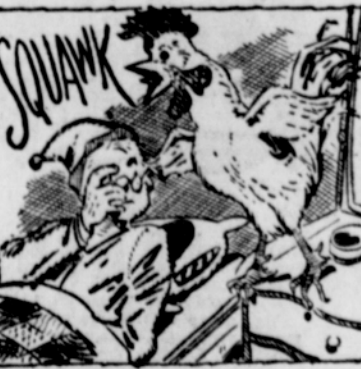
The Internal Revenue Bureau reported the nation's distillers used 291,083,089 pounds—about 5.2 million bushels of all grains in February. That compared with 94,039,532 pounds—about 1,680,000 bushels—in January when controls were on.

Congress ignored a request by President Truman and Secretary of Agriculture Anderson to extend the controls beyond January. Anderson said he intended to set a limit of 2.5 million bushels in February, which would have been half the reported consumption.

Distillery grain usage in February, however, was far below that of February 1947. It then totaled 386,663,030 pounds, or about 6.9 million bushels, according to Revenue Bureau figures. Corn and corn products accounted for more than half of all grain used by distillers last February—156,811,941 pounds, or about 2.8 million bushels.

Rye and rye products accounted for 48,399,492 pounds or about 884,000 bushels. Use of wheat and wheat products amounted to 6,407,895 pounds or about 106,000 bushels.

Expensive Alarm



Why keep a rooster when an alarm clock is cheaper?

That question is posed by Boyd A. Ivory, Wyoming agricultural extension service poultry specialist. A rooster, Ivory points out, eats about \$5 worth of feed a year at current prices. All you get in return, he insists, is a lot of crowing—accompanied by NO eggs!

A rooster is worthless in a poultry flock unless he is being used for breeding purposes in supplying fertile eggs for hatcheries or home incubation.

Hens won't lay any more eggs than they are laying just because a rooster is on the premises, so why not sell that "crowing so-and-so"?

Trade him for a \$1.93 alarm clock that tells the time of day for the entire 24 hours and you'll save about \$3 in feed costs on the swap!
