#### SPECIAL ELECTION NOTICE FOR CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON, MAY 11TH, 1948

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That a special election will be held in the City of Cottage Grove, on the 11th day of May, 1948 from the hour of eight o'clock in the forenoon to the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon, and at said election the following proposed Ordinance No. 1291 will be submitted to the electors of said city, initiated by a petition of the electors of said city and referred to the electors by the Common Council, for their approval or rejection, to-wit:

"ORDINANCE NO. 1291 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INCREASED TAX LEVY OF \$18,088.47 OVER THE AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION II, ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON, FOR THE ENSUING FISCAL PERIOD JULY 1, 1948 TO JUNE 30, 1949.

WHEREAS, the Budget of the City of Cottage Grove, as prepared by the Budget Committee, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949 calls for a tax levy as follows, to-wit:

Street	15,007.00
Sewer	5,425.00
Bond and Warrant	
Indebtedness	1,716.12
Emergency	3,000.00
Library	1,000.00
Park	500.00
5 Mill Levy for Sewers & Drains	6,671.97

Total \$46,199.09 against all of the taxable property within the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, for the purpose of deriving funds necessary to carry on the different departments and meet the expenses of the City government of said City, and create sinking funds for the various outstanding bonds and obligations of the city; and

WHEREAS the levy within the constitutional limitation of Section II, Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, based upon the highest tax levy within the last three years plus six per cent (6%) is \$28,110.62, which amount is not sufficient for raising funds necessary to carry on the different departments and meet the expenses of the City Government of said City and create sinking funds for the various outstanding bonds and obligations of said City, and the amount of tax necessary for said purpose in excess of the six per cent (6%) limitation proposed to be levied for said ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1948 to June 30, 1948 is \$18,088.47 not including the sum of \$6,671.97 to be raised by special levy of 5 mills, heretofore authorized by the voters of said City of Cottage Grove for sewers drains, etc., said 5 mill levy being outside of said six per cent (6%) limitation and not including the sum of \$1,716.12 for bond and warrant interest.

GAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, DO ORDAIN:

Section I. That the annual levy of taxes for the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1948 to June 30, 1949 be increased \$18,088.47 over the amount limited by Section II, Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, based upon the highest levy within the last three years, plus six per cent (6%), amounting to \$28,110.62, and the said amount of \$18,088.47 being in excess of the six per cent (6%) limitation aforesaid, and being necessary in order to derive funds to carry on the different departments of said City

and to meet the expenses of the government of said City, caused by the increased cost of labor and materials, and to provide further and additional funds for street and sewer construction and repairs."
