PAUL AND AGRIPPA

In the book of Acts of the Apostles, chapter twenty-six, is the story of Paul and King Agrippa. A reply from Agrippa to Paul reveals what Paul was attempting to do as he preached to this King. Notice it: "And Agrippa said unto Paul, Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian." Acts 26:28. Paul was trying to persuade Agrippa to become a Christian. This is exactly the same general purpose of the church of Christ today in your community. We are trying to get people to become such as Paul wanted this ruler to be—simply a Christian. We are not trying to persuade people to join any of the denominations. Such groups were not in existence in Paul's day. The church that Jesus built was the only church known in New Testament times. Yes, kind reader, only the church of Christ was known then. People were not asked to join "the church of their choice". When they obeyed the gospel of Christ, God added them to the one church that was Divinely established—the church of Christ. (Read Acts, chap. 2) Consider the name "Christian". It was the name worn by members of the church of Christ. They wore no denominational or sectarian names such as the world now recognizes. The church of Christ in your community pleads for a return to the name of Christ. He built a church and called it "my church". Why not call it by His name?
