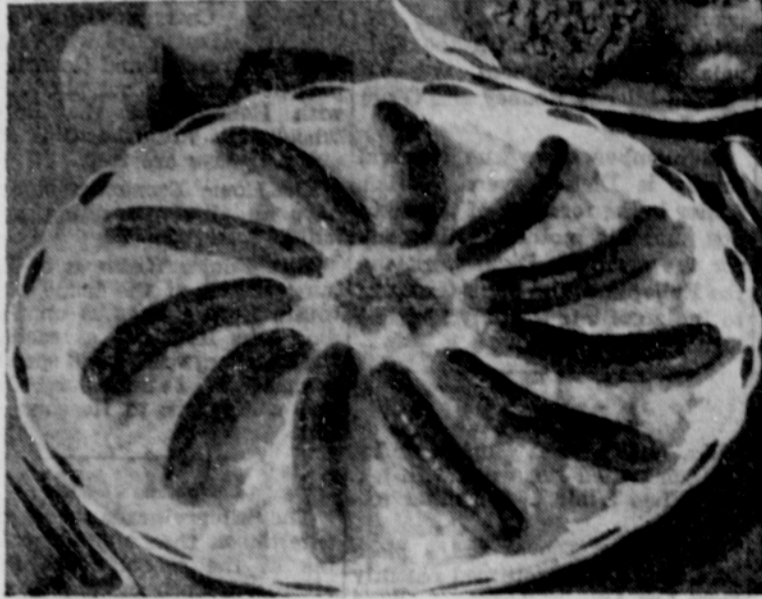

COOKERY CORNER



A big Sunday morning breakfast or after-church "brunch" means real relaxation in eating! For the main dish of this leisurely meal, no choice could be more welcome than well browned pork sausage links served with fluffy scrambled eggs. To cook the links to juice tenderness, use low heat during cooking.

Settling down to a big morning meal on Sunday is one of the pleasantest of eating customs. In planning the menu for this leisurely meal, the most important item is the meat dish! A happy choice is a big platter of well browned, tender pork sausage links served with fluffy scrambled eggs.

To cook pork sausage links to the peak of goodness, use low heat and cook slowly to a rich golden brown. Cook thoroughly, about 15 minutes for small links, but be careful not to overcook as this dries out the meat. One of the easiest ways to prepare sausage links (either breakfast size or larger) is to steam them first in a little water, as follows:

Place links in a cool skillet. Do not prick the skins. Add about 3 tablespoons water, cover skillet, and let steam about 5 minutes. This will insure thorough cooking of the pork. Uncover skillet and drain off any water. Cook sausage links over low heat, turning often until well browned on all sides. Drain off any fat as it accumulates.

To prepare fluffy scrambled eggs, use 1 tablespoon of milk for each egg. Cream may be used for a slightly richer flavor. Beat eggs only slightly, using a fork or eggbeater. Season with salt and pepper and about a tablespoon of Worcestershire sauce for every four eggs. Pour into a heated, greased skillet. In cooking, use low heat; constant stirring is unnecessary. As the mixture thickens, lift it up from the bottom and sides of the skillet with a fork and let the thin uncooked portion flow underneath. The texture of the eggs will be better if they are not constantly stirred.

To vary the flavor of the scrambled eggs for brunch or Sunday supper, add a little grated onion, a few chopped chives, a little chili

sauce, or some browned mushrooms.

Round out the pork sausage breakfast with chilled orange, pineapple, and grapefruit juice or grapefruit and orange cup; cooked cereal with brown sugar, or dry cereal topped sliced canned peaches or bananas; pecan rolls; and plenty of hot coffee.

Another good pork sausage breakfast or supper dish is pork sausage scrapple. This cornmeal pork mixture, delicately seasoned with sage, cut into slices and fried. It's very tasty!

PORK SAUSAGE SCRAPPLE
1 pound bulk pork sausage
1 cup cornmeal
4 cups boiling water or stock
1 teaspoon salt
Sage

Lightly brown sausage, crumbling with a fork. Drain off fat. Add cornmeal slowly to rapidly boiling water or stock. Stir constantly until mush is thickened, then cook in a double boiler for about 15 minutes. Stir in pork sausage and mix thoroughly. Season with salt, pepper and a pinch of sage to suit taste. Cook over low heat for another 15 minutes. Pack hot scrapple into loaf pan rinsed with hot water. Cool.

Cover with waxed paper and store in refrigerator. To cook: slice about 1/4 inch thick and pan fry until well browned. Serve with maple syrup.

SPECIAL ELECTION NOTICE FOR CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON, MAY 21, 1948

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That a special election will be held in the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, on Friday, the 21st day of May, 1948, from the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon to the hour of 8 o'clock in the afternoon, and at said election the following Charter Amendments will be submitted to the electors of said city for their approval or rejection, to-wit:

"An Act to Amend the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, by adding a new chapter thereto authorizing and empowering the Common Council of the City to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City in the amount of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of purchasing, acquiring, establishing, constructing, equipping and improving a municipal airport for the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon," initiated by petition of the electors of said city and referred to the electors by the Common Council for their approval or rejection. Also

"An Act to Amend the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon by adding a new chapter thereto (which will take effect July 1, 1948) abolishing the office of the City Manager and the office of Municipal Judge and restoring unto the Mayor, City Recorder and Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove, certain powers and duties and fixing the duties and powers of the Mayor, City Recorder and Common Council; Making the office of the City Recorder an elective office and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith," initiated by petition of the electors of said city and referred to the electors by the Common Council for their approval or rejection.

The judges and clerks of election and voting places in each ward shall be the same as in the precincts in each of the wards of said city at the general primary election to be held on said date, all as provided by Ordinance No. 1295 and 1296, passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on April the 26th, 1948.

The following are the Charter Amendments to be voted on:
CHARTER AMENDMENT AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, LANE COUNTY, OREGON, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER THERETO AUTHORIZING AND EMPOWERING THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY TO ISSUE AND SELL NEGOTIABLE BONDS OF THE CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN

THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$18,000.00), OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING, ACQUIRING, ESTABLISHING, CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING A MUNICIPAL AIRPORT FOR THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, LANE COUNTY, OREGON.

THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF COTTAGE GROVE, LANE COUNTY, OREGON:

Section 1: That the Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City to the amount of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of purchasing, acquiring, establishing, constructing, equipping and improving a Municipal Airport for the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon.

Section 2: That the bonds hereby authorized shall be denominated "Cottage Grove Airport Bonds". They shall be a general obligation of the City of Cottage Grove and shall be in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, or both, or in multiples thereof in the discretion of the Common Council of Cottage Grove, Oregon. The first installment of the principal shall fall due and be payable not later than one (1) year after date, and the last installment not later than ten (10) years from date of issue, and the installments of principal shall either be equal or substantially equal in amount, or the combined installments of principal and interest due in any year, shall be, as nearly as practicable, in such sums as will permit of an equal annual tax levy for the retirement of the principal of and the payment of the interest on said bonds. Said bonds shall be made due and payable ten (10) (10) years from date of their issue and bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five percent (5%)

per annum, interest payable semi-annually; the City of Cottage Grove to reserve the right to retire any or all of said bonds on and after five (5) years from date thereof in accordance with the provisions of Section 97-101 O.C.L.A. and all acts amendatory thereto.

Section 3: The Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove is hereby authorized to include in its general tax levy sufficient special levy to pay the interest on the bonds and provide a sinking fund for the amounts due.

Section 4: The Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove is hereby authorized to issue and sell the said bonds from time to time as they may be necessary for the purpose herein specified, but before any of the bonds shall be

Section 5: The indebtedness authorized by this Amendment to the Charter of the City of Cottage Grove is in addition to all other indebtedness authorized and incurred by the City of Cottage

and shall not be considered as affected by any limitation of the indebtedness in the Charter of the City, or elsewhere.

Section 6: The funds arising from the sale and disposal of all bonds provided for in this act shall be known as "Cottage Grove Airport Bonds", and shall be kept separate and apart from all other funds of the City of Cottage Grove and shall only be used to pay the costs and expenses that may be incurred by the City of Cottage Grove in purchasing, acquiring, establishing, constructing, equipping and improving a Municipal Airport for the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon.

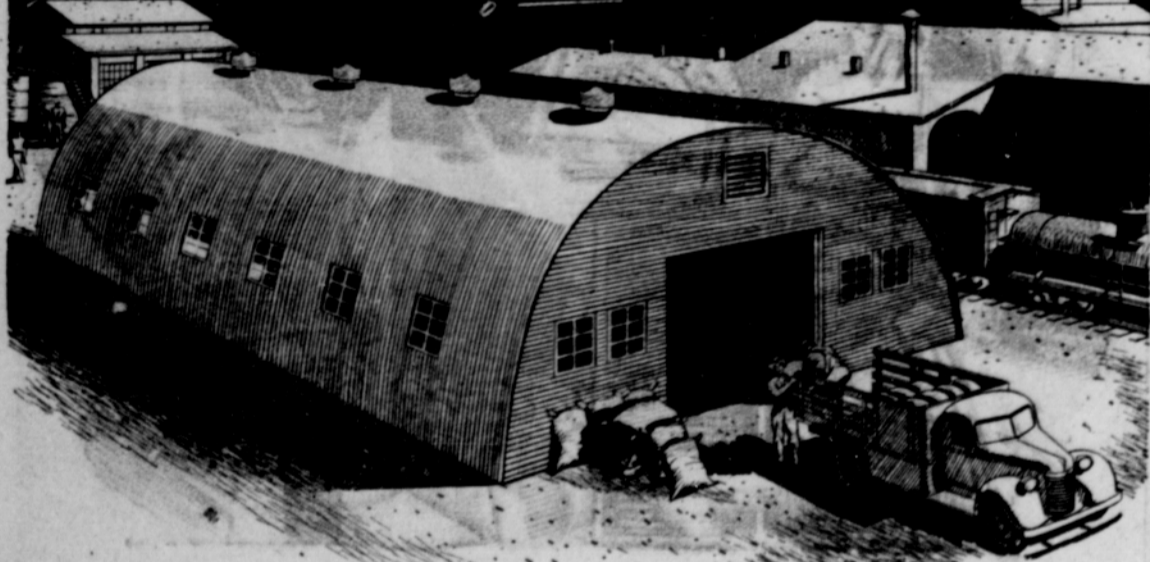
