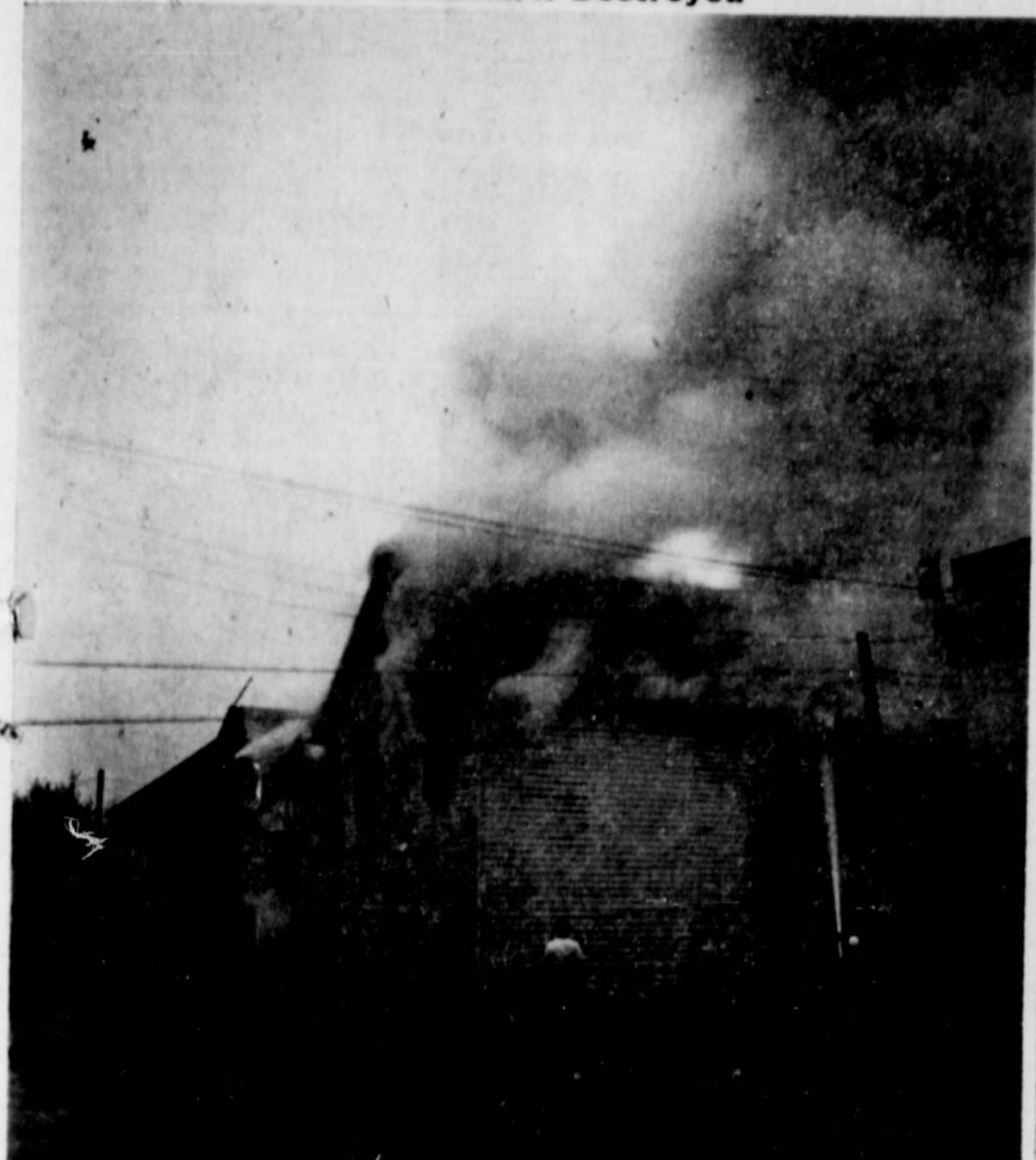


## Old Landmark Destroyed

## Oregon Legion Commander Maris Opposes Veteran Bonus at Meeting

### No Benefit For Veterans

"This is really no great benefit for the veterans," Commander Maris said. "As taxpayers, the veterans would have to help finance the bonus and taxes would be even higher."

Commander Maris continued his talk with mention of the various Legion youth programs throughout the state. He especially stressed the Legion-sponsored Junior Legion baseball, Beaver Boy State training course, and the annual oratorical contests.

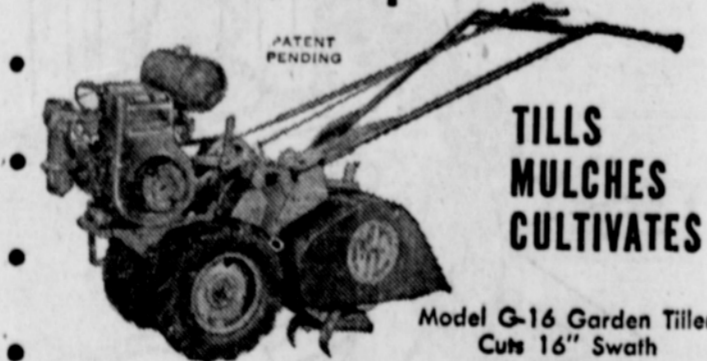
