(Continued from Page 1) member, who has worked with Ferrin several years says Mr. Ferrin has the best school organization he ever saw and has details at his fingertips. If he can't tell you, he (Ferrin) can turn to the information wanted in the files within two minutes.

In the way of professional recognition, Mr. Ferrin was made a member of Phi Delta Kappa national education honor fraternity, served as chairman of the state curriculum committee for five years, president of the Lane-county unit of Oregon Educational Association and is at present vice president of executive committee of state committee on physical education and health. In community activities he is past president of the Lion's club, officer in the Presbyterian church and chairman of the inter church council.

At Lakeview where he has accepted the position of superintendent, the district is first class with three grade schools and a standard high school. The schools are now housed there with four buildings in addition to a new gym and a separate agriculture shop. A building program is anticipated in another year.
