Bobby Gasper, Junior Cottage Grove Golfer, Makes Team to Nationals

In the event that important happenings may escape your attention as it did ours last week, it seems that a Cottage Grove junior golfer in a history last week at Portland when he entered the national junior amateur golf championship tournament at the Mt. View golf course in Portland and made the four man team to the nationals.

On June 21st, Bob Gasper of Cottage Grove was one of the twenty eight youngsters to tee at the Portland Junior Chamber of Commerce qualifying rounds and came out as a member of a team of four to qualify for the National Junior Amateur golf championship at Lincoln, Nebraska on August 3 to 7.

Gasper described on the sports page of the Oregonian as a stocky strong arm belter from Cottage Grove and Bill Kessinger of Portland tied for fourth spot at 148 and Gasper won the last squad post by virtue of a play off victory. Gaspe made 74-74 around the 6,215 yard course. Gasper, we believe was the only high school student among the top four. Dick Eastey, winner of the top spot made the 36 hole course in the two days at 139, five strokes under par. Kessinger gained the first alternate position. Fred Mueller, also of Portland was second alternate. Harvey Hixon of Eugene was elected as third alternate.

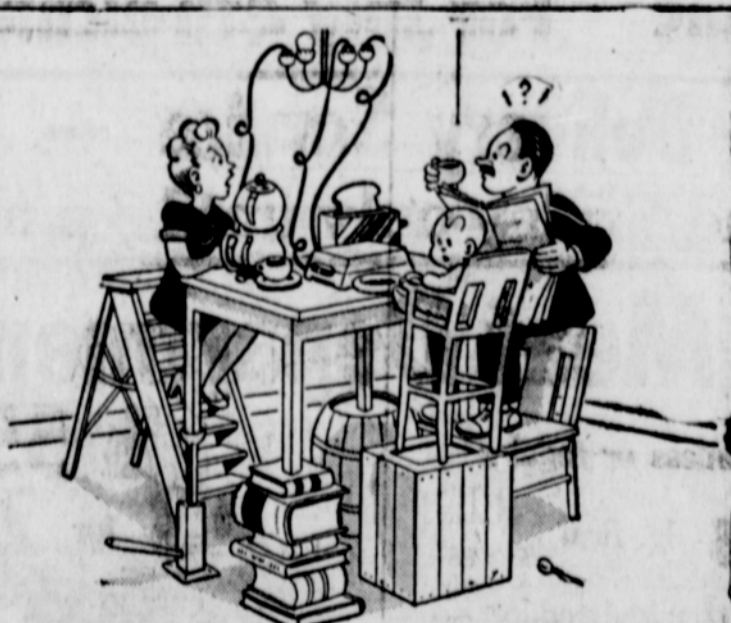
