Pirate Treasure Days at Twin Cities

Oregon's twin-coastal cities North Bend and Coos Bay, will present the first annual Pirate Treasure Days August 6, 7 and 8. Salt water and air resources will be combined for three packed days of thrills and fun. Service and civic clubs have underwritten a \$27,000 budget for the entertainment.

The \$3000 air circus at North Bend's big airport, and a "black light" pageant and sailboat races at Coos Bay, will be highlights.

Interspersing the main events will be dancing in the hangar, amateur air contests and exhibitions, gas model plane competition. And in the huge hangar, built by the navy during the war, a gay carnival midway will glitter all three days.

Al Leaman, director of the Portland Rose Festival pageant, will produce the "black light" aquacade. In picturesque Mingus park, on a stage built over the lake, the unique show will be presented. Here, too, the Pirate

Treasure Days queen will be crowned—attended by six lovely Pirate princesses.

Just about every stunt on the books is on tap for the air circus. Perhaps the most thrilling will be this:

The pilot kills his engine in mid-air. Then he climbs out on a landing wheel and cranks the prop by hand until the engine starts again.

Other stunts are a delayed parachute jump, take-off and landing from a moving automobile, pick-up of a flag from the ground with a wing tip.

mer Coos Bay Pirates Regatta, abandoned in favor of the bigger, two-city celebration.

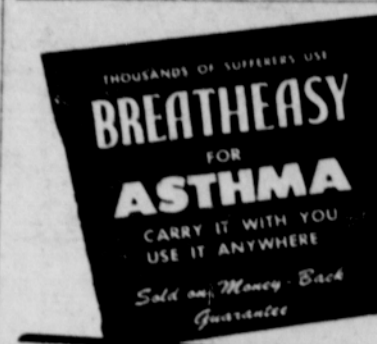
