CROFT EASTER LILY WITH 18 BLOOMS

Route F has nothing on Cottage Grove, out Mosby Creek way, when it comes to raising Croft Easter lilies. This week Glenn Owen brought the Sentinel office a sample of his blooms from yearling bulbs. One bulb produced a stock bearing 18 blooms and the other had 13 blooms.

Mr. Owen has two acres of Croft lilies, 65,000 bulbs. This year the bulbs averaged seven to eight blooms. He expects to have from 25,000 to 30,000 commercial bulbs which have been contracted to Vaughn Seed Company of Chicago.

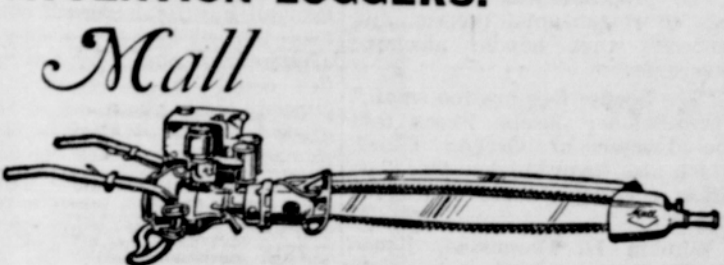
