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July 25 - 31 Nat'l Farm Safety Week

Lane County farmers can make their farms safer as well as do their part in National Farm Safety Week by removing at least one hazard for each member of the farm family this week, states O. S. Fletcher, county agent.

The week of July 25 through 31 has been designated National Farm Safety Week by the National Safety Council and the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Here in Oregon, the farm safety campaign is being headed up by the Oregon Farm Safety Council. This group, made up of representatives from the State Industrial Accident Commission, Oregon State College Extension Service, farm organizations and equipment dealers, is attempting to point out that many accidents on Oregon farms might be prevented.

James E. Wiles, farm safety representative, State Industrial Accident Commission, has stated that accidents involving workers' fingers are most frequently reported in Oregon. Finger hurts were involved in 16 percent of the cases reported to the commission during 1947. Next most frequently injured part of the body was the back, being reported in 10 percent of the cases.

The small hand tools — axes, knives, pitchforks, hammers and hoes — were frequently mentioned as attributing causes to accidents.

Falls are the leading type of farm accident, according to the National Safety Council. Machinery accidents rank second; those involving handtools and animals are tied for third place.

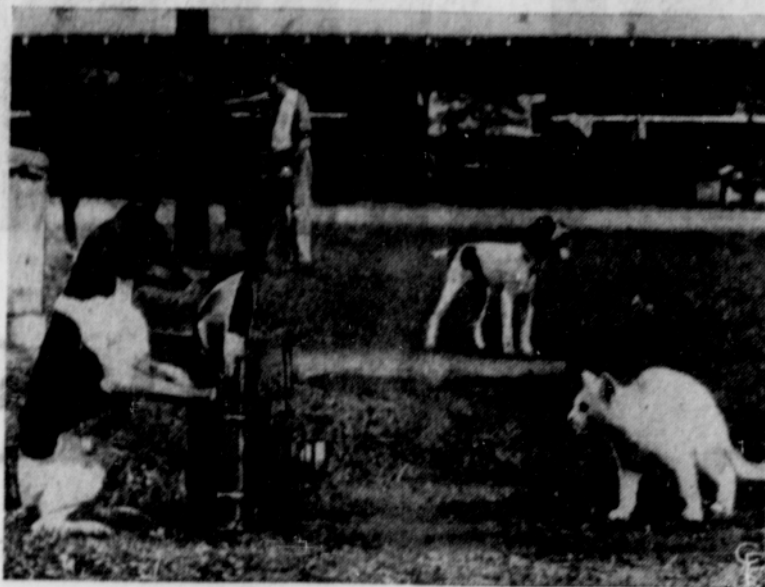
In the United States during 1947, approximately 300,000 farm workers were injured. Of this number, 4300 were killed while engaged in routine agricultural work. Insurance companies do not list the occupation, "farmer", as a safe enterprise.

Some of the following are farm hazards that caused accidents in Lane County during the past year, according to Mr. Fletcher: Unsafe bull pens; defective handtools; rotten boards in haylofts; worn ropes; nails in loose boards; rubbish in yard; improper hitching to power machinery; dry weeds, brush, old lumber, etc.

1947 Traffic Toll

Traffic death toll in 1947 estimated by the national safety council at 32,500, which is 1,200 less than were killed in motor vehicle accidents in 1946 and 7,409 less than in 1941. Since mileage in 1947 is estimated about 10 per cent more than in 1946 and 12 per cent above 1941, the 1947 fatality rate—deaths per 100 million vehicle miles—was between 8.5 and 9, the lowest in the nation's history, the council said.
