Final Hunting Regulations Are Set By State Game Commission

The Oregon State Game Commission set the hunting regulations for 1948, Saturday, July 24th. The most drastic change from the tentative regulations announced earlier this month was the regulation for Ringneck pheasants. Late brood counts carried on by district game agents showed a marked improvement throughout most of the state from those made earlier in the season. With this information the Commission extended the season slightly throughout the state with a still longer extension in Malheur county. The final regulation reads: Open season, noon October 29 to November 2, inclusive, in all counties except Jefferson, Malheur, Union, Wallowa, Baker, Curry, Lincoln and Tillamook. Bag limit 2 cocks per day or 4 per season. Malheur county — Open season, noon October 29 to November 7, inclusive. Bag limit 2 cocks per day or 6 for the season. The Valley Quail regulation reads: Open season, noon October 29 to November 2, inclusive, in Coos, Josephine, Jackson, Klamath, Lake, Des-

Year Enlistment Is Accepted in Army For 18 Year Olds

Application may be made now for one year enlistment in the Army of the United States or the Air Force of the United States by those young men who are now eighteen years of age, having not reached their nineteenth birthday. If application has been made, and they are not called before their nineteenth birthday, they may still be enlisted for a one year period.

Application for this one year enlistment may be made at the U. S. Army and U. S. Air Force, Recruiting Station, the Armory, Cottage Grove.

Four Enlist in Army

Recent enlistments for the regular army from the Cottage Grove area are: Carl W. Ericsson, who reenlisted July 14th, for a period of six years for duty with the Eleventh airborne division, currently stationed in Japan; Richard E. Christina, Lorane route, Cottage Grove, formerly employed by Nichols Radio and Appliance shop, enlisted July 19, for a period of four years, with the Army security agency, signal corps. Christina, an ex-navy man, was enlisted as a technical sergeant; and Thomas H. Hennessy, 639 North Tenth St., Cottage Grove, was reenlisted July 21st, for three years with the Fourth infantry division, Ft. Ord, California. Hennessy, who during the early part of the last war was taken prisoner by the Japanese, at Corregidor, was reenlisted as sergeant.

The Cool Cupboard

Foods that need cool air and ventilation in the places they are kept include dried fruits, canned foods, relishes, nuts, cereals, whole-grain flour, chocolate, peanut butter, salad oils and cooking fats. The same is true of potatoes and other root vegetables, apples, and citrus fruits, which shrivel, sprout and spoil in warm kitchen bins. They need coolness to preserve their flavor, freshness and food value.

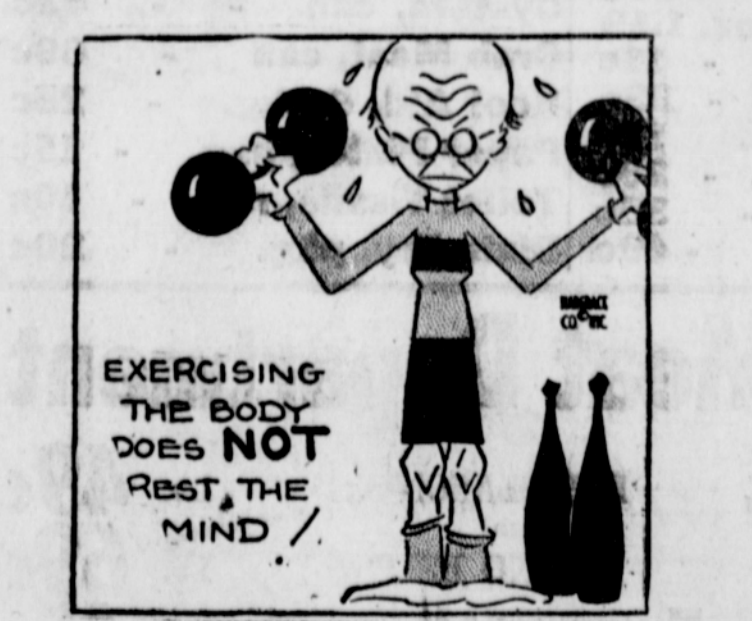
