New Stamp Honors Founder of Girl Scout Movement

A 3-cent commemorative stamp honoring the founder of Girl Scouting in the United States, Juliette Gordon Low, will go on first day of sale in Savannah, Ga., on Friday, October 29, just two days before the Girl Scouts celebrate the 26th anniversary of their founding. Issue of the stamp was authorized July 3 of this year by President Harry S. Truman.

Since stamp collectors are particularly interested in new stamps, the Three Rivers Girl Scout Council officers in Eugene will make it a point to get information as soon as possible as to the date the stamp will go on sale locally. Collectors are reminded that first day covers (or cachets) may be obtained from the postmaster in Savannah, Ga., from the Girl Scout headquarters, or from companies making cachets. Specific information on how to order may be obtained from the Eugene Girl Scout office.

HOLIDAY DECORATIONS EASILY MADE

Attractive ways to use native Oregon evergreen material for Christmas wreaths and other decorations is described in a mimeograph circular prepared by the O. S. C. extension service in home economics. The circular, now in the hands of all home demonstration agents, is illustrated with sketches showing construction of wreaths, garlands, evergreen balls and table decorations.

Defective Flues Cause Number of Fires Past Week

Defective flues which have caused a number of fires here within the past few days has brought a warning from C. V. Douglas, fire chief that flues should be inspected and checked for defects before winter sets in, otherwise you as a home owner might be the next to suffer from a bad fire.

Doughty Residence Burns
The most destructive fire of the week was a six room residence of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Doughty, who live 11 miles west on the Lorane highway, which burned to the ground. The local fire department responded to the call, but found the building a total loss.

It was not learned how much household furniture was saved. Along with the building 600 quarts of canned goods were lost. It was estimated that the loss will exceed \$3000.00. There was no insurance on the building or contents, it was said.

When members of the fire department answered the call, they said they thought it was within the six mile limit of the Southern Lane Rural Fire Protective Association, and finding that the fire was five miles farther on, the equipment was driven on in the hope that the department might be of some help. The fire was said to have been due to a defective flue.

Saturday the fire department answered a call from the Ted Self Service Laundry and found that a defective thermostat had caused a dryer of clothes to burn up. Sunday a fire call was answered at the home of John White at 243 North H. street. The blaze originating from a defective flue caused about \$50.00 damage around the flue.

Monday a call was answered at the home of Mr. and Mrs. S. P. Radtke at 43 North K. street. Fire of an unknown origin burned a corner of the kitchen, causing damages estimated at about \$200.

NEW SHELL BURNER CUTS OIL CONSUMPTION

An ingenious patented device which reduces home fuel oil consumption almost 25 per cent has been made available, royalty free, effective October 1, to oil burner manufacturers who wish to incorporate it into the design of their burners. H. Norcross, vice president of Shell Development Company, announced today. Shell Development Company is the research affiliate of Shell Oil Company, Incorporated.

The device is a new combustion head, developed in Shell's Seward, New Jersey, fuel oil laboratory, for use with high pressure, gun-type oil burners. The Company is offering the design of the device without charge to the burner industry in the interests of fuel oil conservation, Mr. Norcross said, so that as many consumers as possible can take advantage of the fuel savings that have ranged from 136 to 994 gallons annually in 18 test homes.

Rocky Mountain Park
Reached over an excellent system of paved highways only 50 miles northwest of Denver is Rocky Mountain national park. Possessing some of the most thrilling mountain scenery on the entire continent, the Rockies here tower endlessly above secluded, lake-studded canyons. Long's peak reaches an elevation of 14,255 feet. The park contains 405.34 square miles, and was established in 1915.
