UNAC WORLD-WIDE DRIVE REACHES \$31,000,000

LAKE SUCCESS, New York—Latest reports to the headquarters of the United Nations Appeal for Children here show that world-wide contributions to UNAC total almost \$31,000,000, in 35 of the 50 participating countries.

Eighty-seven per cent of the money collected in UNAC campaigns thus far—\$26,808,691—is allocated for relief in other than contributing countries. This consists of \$11,071,568 allocated to the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF); \$14,202,795 to private agencies; and \$1,534,328 to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

CHLORINE USED TO BLEACH WALNUTS ON SMALL SCALE

Methods of bleaching walnuts on a small scale, by those who want to improve the appearance either for sale or as gifts, are explained in a small mimeographed experiment station circular of information No. 442 by E. H. Wiegand, head of the department of food technology at O. S. C.

Household chlorine compounds are the active ingredients used in the bleaching solution recommended. Sound walnuts thoroughly dried are poured into a bleaching bath made by adding 9 ounces of 16 per cent chlorine solution to each gallon of water. The circular contains a table showing the varying amounts for different strength chlorine solutions. Usually a three-minute bath will give a satisfactory bleach, after which the nuts are drained and redried in the shade, preferably indoors in a draft or in a drier with low heat. Drying in the sun causes the nuts to crack, Wiegand warns.
