

Vet Farm Loans Of \$6000 Granted Without Delay

Assurance was given today by Director William F. Gaarenstroom of the state Department of Veterans' Affairs that applications for the \$6,000 Oregon veterans' farm and home loan will be processed without further delay.

The director said last week's successful sale of \$2,000,000 of loan bonds to finance the program has eliminated the waiting period forced on applicants for loans in November, when they were told that funds were not immediately available because the bonds failed to sell in the department's offering on November 5.

Seven investment firms competed in the repeat offering of Dec. 7, with the successful bid going to Halsey, Stuart & Co., of Chicago at 1.748 per cent effective interest rate. This makes \$12,000,000 in bonds sold by the veterans' department to date.

November applications for loans dropped to 199, or 76 fewer than in October and the lowest since last February, due to the temporary financial setback and due partly also to normal seasonal conditions, the director said.

However, the department disbursed \$835,900 in November to 193 Oregon veterans who had applied earlier for funds to purchase homes and farms.

The agency was in operation nearly two years before reaching the million-dollar mark. The last \$9,000,000 were loaned in the past 17 months. The peak of loan activities was reached in July of this year, with loans averaging more than \$825,000 a month since then.

No bid for less than the appraised value will be considered. Each bid must be submitted in duplicate and be accompanied by a deposit. The deposit must be in cash, by money order, or cashier's check or certified check on a solvent bank, drawn payable to the Treasurer of the United States. The amount of the deposit for sales over \$1,000,000 will be \$1,000.00 plus 10% of that portion, if any, of the amount bid over \$1,000.00 up to \$10,000.00; plus an additional 5% of that portion, if any, of the amount bid over \$10,000.00 up to \$100,000.00; and plus an additional 3% of that portion, if any, of the amount bid in excess of \$100,000.00. If the total amount of the bid is less than \$1,000.00, the deposit shall equal the amount of the bid. The deposit will be returned to unsuccessful bidders; applied as a part of the purchase price of the successful bidder; or that portion of the deposit, representing the minimum required by law, shall be retained as liquidated damages if the high bidder does not execute contract and furnish satisfactory bond within thirty days of acceptance of the bid or cannot furnish evidence of his ability to comply with the local marketing requirements if the tract lies within the boundaries of the O. & C. grant. This evidence must be submitted with the bid and shall conform with the requirements as set forth in this advertisement. In sales over \$5,000.00, and in small sales when required, the successful bidder will be required to furnish a sworn financial statement, in duplicate, showing ability to fulfill the terms of the contract. A bond on all sales will be required in an amount computed at the rate of at least 20 per cent of the first \$10,000.00 of the bid, plus 10 per cent of any additional amount of the bid in excess of \$10,000.00. Payment for timber will be required in advance of cutting, payment in full at the time of filing the contract being required in sales amounting to \$10,000.00 or less. In larger sales, at the option of the Regional Administrator, payment may be made in a number of installments scheduled to keep pace with the rate of timber cutting and payable upon demand from the Regional Administrator. The right is hereby reserved to waive technical defects in this ad-

vertisement and to reject any and all bids. Timber lying within the boundaries of the O. & C. grant, sold in accordance with this advertisement, must be manufactured within the marketing area as designated for each tract described below in accordance with the Orders of the Secretary of the Interior, No. 2285, and Nos. 2390 to 2399, Incl., dated December 11, 1946 and November 29, 1947, respectively. The United States has by agreement been given the right to authorize its purchasers to use certain roads and right-of-ways for the removal of timber. Each bidder should ascertain from the

respective District Forester of the location of the right-of-way covered by such agreement, relating to the tract upon which he wishes to bid. It is the bidder's responsibility to determine for himself the extent to which such agreement will permit the use of the road or right-of-way subject to the payment of reasonable compensation to the assignor of the United States. 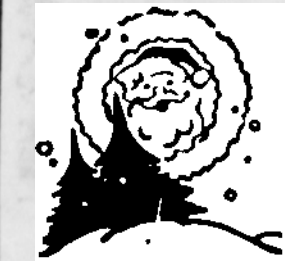
