CONSTELLATION CLUB 6TH

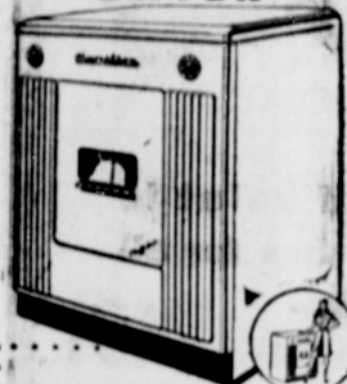
