OSC to Launch Northern Cage Campaign Jan. 7-8

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Jan. 4—With a 14-game pre-season slate behind it, Oregon State's promising basketball team will launch its Northern division conference campaign against defending coast champion Washington at Seattle Friday and Saturday nights.

The Beavers wound up their practice schedule against Portland University at McMinnville Monday night and will depart for Seattle Thursday, arriving in time for a workout that night.

Highlight of Oregon State's non-counting slate was the first annual Pacific Coast conference tournament at San Francisco last week in which the Beavers grabbed off third place and the consolation prize. After having an off day in the tourney opener when they absorbed a 60-40 licking from Southern California, Coach Slat's Giff's men came back strong to nip Washington 64-62, and then trim powerful UCLA 62-58.

Although the Orange edged Washington in a thrilling battle at San Francisco, Gill and his players are anticipating a much rougher time at Seattle on the Huskies' home floor. Washington was weakened considerably in the tournament by the loss of Captain Bill Vandenberg and Guard Andy Opacich because of flu. Both men are expected to be ready for action against the Beavers this week end.

Gill probably will start a considerably revamped lineup in the league opener as a result of showings of his men in the Cow Palace tourney. Veteran Al Petersen and Sophomore Glen Kinney probably will be at the forwards; Transfer Ray Snyder at Center, and Captain Cliff Crandall and Tommy Holman at the guard slots. Crandall was named to the tournament all-star first team.

Dan Torrey, letterman guard who severely sprained his achilles tendon when he slipped on a wet spot in the Cow Palace may be able to see some action this week end.

VanderKley said the teams would appear in new uniforms. The trophy won last season by the Edwards Outdoor cagers will be awarded the winners this year. If any one team wins the cup for three years it becomes a permanent possession of the team. If the JayCees have a successful season financially, they plan to use the net proceeds of the season in needed repairs of the interior of the armory.

Playing time will be Monday and Tuesday of each week. Admission of 35 cents will be charged for adults and 20 cents for children. The sponsors hope for support of this undertaking and for the price of admission as listed above, the fans can witness a double header each playing evening.

Fans will be amazed at the extreme height of the entire Axemen squad. There are 6 boys on the Eugene squad who tower above the 6'3" mark. One boy measures 6'6" and another measures 6'5", which tops anything on the Lions' squad by 2 to 3 inches.

On the basis of pre-season games, this game is rated as a toss up. However, because of their extreme height, the Lions expect to have a great deal of trouble controlling the boards and in holding the Axemen down.

The Lions have won 8 out of 10 pre-season games, whereas the Axemen have not fared as well, but have looked impressive even when losing. Eugene has lost two games to Coos Bay, two games to Klamath Falls, one game to Salem, and has defeated Ashland and the SOCE Frosh. They soundly trounced Ashland, which in turn defeated the Lions by a comfortable margin.

The Lions will have to be hot to defeat this big rugged team from Eugene high school but the local five has shown a great deal of class in most of its pre-season games and although they expect trouble from the Eugene giants, the boys are planning to post a win in their second conference clash.
