Meal of the Week BY MARY LEE TAYLOR

- Hamburger Patties
- Pickle Relish
- Hamburger Buns
- French Fried Potatoes
- Tomato Corn Salad (Recipe below)
- Sliced Bananas in Orange Juice

Tomato Corn Salad

- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 6 tablespoons cold water
- 1/2 cup tomato juice
- 1 teaspoon grated onion
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- few grains pepper
- 4 teaspoons vinegar
- 1 1/2 cups drained, whole kernel corn
- 1/4 cup finely cut stuffed olives
- 1/2 cup Fat Milk

Soften gelatin in 1/4 cup water. Heat to boiling a mixture of tomato juice, grated onion, salt, pepper and vinegar. Stir in softened gelatin. Take out 1/2 cup of mixture and mix with remaining 2 tablespoons water. Pour into an oiled quart mold. Chill until firm. Chill remaining portion of gelatin mixture until slightly thicker than unbeaten egg whites. Fold in mixture of remaining ingredients. Put on top of chilled tomato mixture. Chill until firm. Unmold on lettuce. Makes 4 servings.
