The school budget for '49-'50 was passed at a meeting Jan. 6 by a vote of 18-8. The new budget provides for seven teachers and a principal with a general increase in salary of 5%, which also applies to the janitor and clerk. At present there are five teachers and a principal. The enrollment at the beginning of the year was 158 with an average daily attendance in Dec. of 130 pupils.
The first section of the new addition composed of four rooms has been nicely completed and mostly moved into altho' temporary oil circulators are in use until the new furnace can be installed. There is an extra room for music room and two vacant rooms at present. The second addition at the other end of the building is started. It is composed of one classroom or library, a reception room, teachers room and a room for temporary care of children who become ill at school. In order to complete this and to install the furnace a bond for \$20,000 will soon be voted on. The original bond of \$55,000 voted in to cover costs was not sufficient. It is time every voter considered real school needs. People who know say that Cottage Grove will be in need of more space next year in spite of the new 10th St. building.
