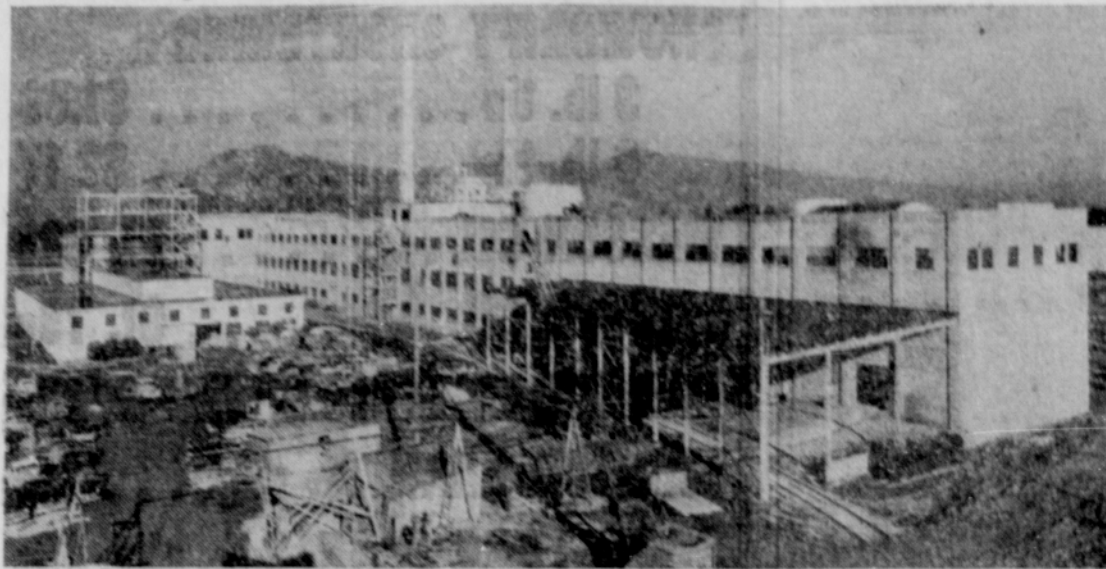
Try This Recipe RICE KRISPIES MARSHMALLOW SQUARES

1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/2 pound marshmallows (about 2 1/2 dozen)
1/2 teaspoon vanilla (if desired)
1 package Kellogg's Rice Krispies (5 1/2 ounces)
Cook butter and marshmallows over hot water until thick and syrupy. Add vanilla; beat thoroughly. Put Rice Krispies in large greased bowl and pour on marshmallow mixture, stirring briskly. Press into greased shallow pan; cut into squares when cool. Yield: 24 2 1/4-inch squares (9x13-inch pan).

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Weyerhaeuser's New Pulp Plant at Springfield



SPRINGFIELD, OREGON — In this large building, 580 feet long and 60 feet wide, will be installed machinery for processing Kraft pulp into container board. Weyerhaeuser Timber Company's new pulp plant at Springfield will derive its raw material from logs and sawmill wood not usable for lumber production. Sawmill wood will come in part from company's integrated sawmilling facilities on same plant site and also from outside sources.
