

Millers Upset Lions 31-29, Throw District Six Into Three-Way Tie

Springfield's Darwin Allison dropped in a field goal with only five seconds of game time remaining Friday night to break a tie score and upset the Cottage Grove Lions, 31-29, on the Miller floor.

The loss throws the district 6 lead into a three-way tie between the Grovers, Eugene and Junction City.

After Larry Anderson had climaxed a brilliant Lion fourth quarter with two free throws, and knotted the score at 29 all, Allison cast off from the center of the floor to bank in the winning points in the game that was thrill packed all the way. The Lions had trailed 24-16 at the end of three quarters of play, but Bob Cook, high scoring Grove center, dropped in seven points in succession to put that team back in the game. Eastburn dropped in two long shots from 30 feet out for the Lions before. Paddock kicked in two free throws. With 15 seconds remaining, the Grove cheer section went wild when Anderson potted the two foul shots to tie the game. That was before Allison cast off with his desperate long shot that hit.

Springfield got off to an early lead and Eastburn was the only Grover who could hit the net. All this added up to the first period score, which favored the Millers 7-4.

The Lion defense tightened in the second quarter and allowed the Springfield quint only two points, while Cook joined Eastburn in the Grove's score column. Together they ran the halftime to 10-9 in Cottage Grove's favor.

King, Paddock, and Johnson

teamed together to boost the Miller lead in the third period. Cook carried the burden of Lion scoring which left them on the low end of the 24-16 count at the end of three quarters of play.

Bob Cook led all scorers for the evening and was followed by Don Eastburn with 16 and 10 points, respectively. Together they scored all but 3 of their team's total points. Paddock led Springfield scoring with 9.

The Springfield band and baton team performed during the half-time intermission.

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Lions Stage Last Scoring Spurt Win From Uni Hi 47-37

A last minute scoring spurt, the like of which has never before been seen by Cottage Grove fans, enabled the Lions to down a fired-up bunch of University High Tigers, 47-37, in McArthur court Tuesday night.

With just two minutes of playing time left the Grovers held a slim 37-36 lead after a see-saw game throughout. Suddenly Lion center Bob Cook came to life and dropped two quick fielders through the hemp. Don Eastburn, Lion forward, dunked in another before Anderson of Grove raced half the length of the igloo to score a lay-in and make it 45-36, all in the space of one minute. Tollefson potted a foul shot for the Tigers and Eastburn of the Lions, who played inspired ball all evening, finished all scoring with a lofty field goal.

Cook, who from all early appearances was going to have an off evening, kicked in 12 points in the final five minutes to pace all evening scorers with 18 points. Eastburn, who played a stellar game for the Lions was next with 17. Lynch, who swished in amazing long shots from all angles, led Uni High with 14 points. From all appearances it was definitely the best game of the season for the Tigers, who lost to the cellar-dwelling Elmira Falcons last week. Their ball handling was superior to Grove's but they weakened in the fading minutes through their scoring eye and due to the fact that the Lions were hitting.

Mike Lynch opened for the Tigers and the score was quickly tied by Cook. Frailing put Uni High ahead again and again Cook tied it up. Mickey and Eastburn of Grove exchanged shots with Newburn and Tollefson of the losing team. Eastburn poked several in from all angles, and while the quarter score still favored the Lions 16-13, Lynch was just as hot as ever on the long shots and continually kept the Tigers in the game. In that quarter Mickey picked up three points and Schaffer two for the Grovers, while Newburn collected two for Uni High to round out scoring.

Eastburn and Schaffer strengthened that Lion lead in the second period before Lynch and Newburn teamed up for the Tigers to overshadow the scoring efforts of Cook and Eastburn and give their Alma Mater a tense 25-24 halftime edge.

It was a swish of the net for a swish in the third canto with Eastburn, Cook and Mickey governing Lion scoring. Frailing and Lynch were the Uni High mainstays. Going into the final eight minutes the count seen by the small crowd was an exciting tie, 31 all.

Both cheer sections and fans stood during the opening minutes of the last quarter as the score see-sawed back and forth. That was before the improved Tigers were stunned by the swift Grove scoring pace. Coach Bob Dusenberry used subs during the last minute of play only.

The Lion 'B' squad coasted to an easy 35-24 win in the preliminary with the Tiger 'B's. Halftime score favored the victors 18-14.
