UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, March 30 (Special)—The Big Broadcast of 1949, final program of the school year for the popular student-participation radio production, "Let's Sing, America!", will be held in McArthur court on the University of Oregon campus April 21.

Featured on this year's program of the Big Broadcast will be a chorus of students picked from participating schools, and the Springfield high school band.

During the broadcasts this year, Director Maude Garnett of the university music school, has had participating grade schools alerted to pick out their best director and best soloist in each class. These picked students will meet on the campus April 14 for a final selection. The soloist chosen at this time will sing the program theme song, "The Merry Life", at the April 21 broadcast. The best director will also be featured on the program. All of the children taking part in the April 14 selections will form the chorus for the Big Broadcast.

Song sheets with words of the songs to be sung this year are available at state-owned station KOAC, Corvallis. These sheets also carry instructions for the program routine.

ROGUE RIVER DAM BILL SIGNED

SALEM — Governor Douglas McKay signed into law Saturday the Rogue River Dam bill.

The measure moves the Rogue River's deadline against dams eight miles downstream, and thus removes a state barrier against the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation's \$90,000,000 Rogue River flood control, power and irrigation project.

The bill had passed both houses by huge margins, but sportsmen groups brought heavy pressure upon the Governor to veto it. The sportsmen fear the project would destroy fish life in the Rogue, which is one of the most popular fishing streams and scenic attractions in the country.
