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Recipe of the Week

Angel Chiffon Dessert

1/2 cup Pet Milk 16 two-inch vanilla wafers
1/2 package lemon gelatin 12 marshmallows, cut up
1/2 cup boiling water

Chill milk until ice cold. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Chill until slightly thicker than unbeaten egg whites. Line 4 dessert dishes with vanilla wafers. Whip milk with cold rotary beater, or electric beater at high speed until stiff. Fold into chilled gelatin along with marshmallows. Pile into wafer-lined dishes.

*Orange gelatin also can be used.
