Permits Required Of All Loggers

All logging or similar operations within the forest areas of the state of Oregon where any type of power driven equipment is used are required to obtain a logging or sawmill permit according to H. L. Young, forest inspector. Mr. Young states that apparently many operators are delinquent in this respect and calls attention to the fact that closure of the operation for non-compliance, as well as a fine, may result from failure to secure a permit.

Applications for such permits may be obtained from Mr. Young, D. D. Storm or from the fire patrol office or by writing to the State Forester at Salem. These permits issued by the State Forester are valid for only the year in which issued and for the specific area indicated to be logged in the permit.

Standard Reduces Prices on Heavy Fuel Oils April 1

Standard Oil Company of California Friday announced a 20 cent per barrel reduction in the price of heavy industrial fuel oils such as are generally used by Railroads, Steamship Lines and Utilities and a reduction in the price it pays for certain grades of heavy crude oil.

The reduction in the price paid for purchased heavy crude oil amounts to 30 cents per barrel for 14 degree gravity, with smaller reductions for crudes up to 20 degree gravity. The heavy crudes go largely into the manufacture of heavy fuel oils.

Both postings were effective with the commencement of business Friday morning, April 1.

Additionally, Standard announced marketing of a new Chevron (Premium) Gasoline which it said will provide anti-knock performance in the new high-compression automobile engines and will give maximum efficient performance in older motors.

Because of the higher costs of manufacturing this new high octane gasoline, Standard will increase its wholesale price (tank truck) for Chevron Supreme by one-half (1/2) cent a gallon, to be effective in each locality as distribution of the new gasoline is made. There will be no change in the wholesale price of Chevron (Regular) gasoline.

Ex-Model Held

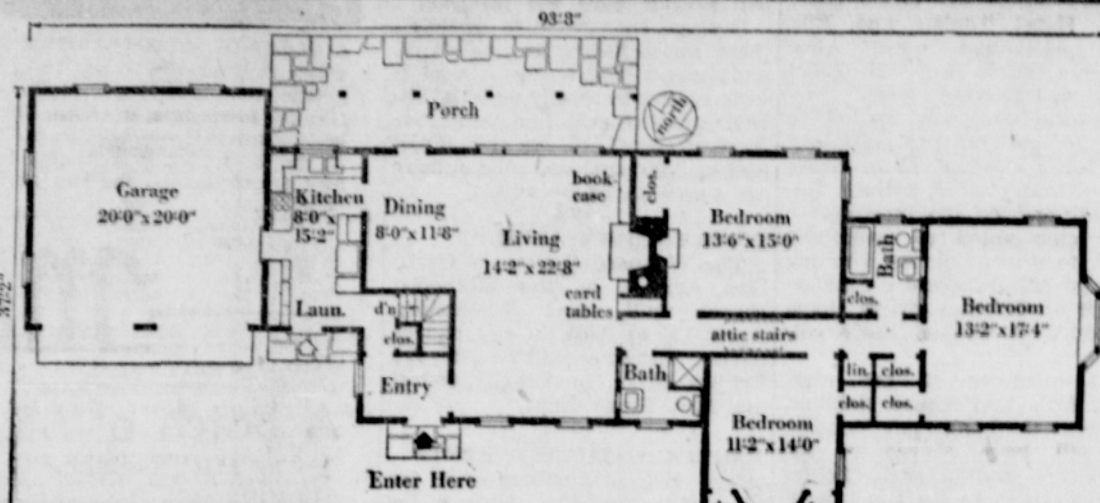

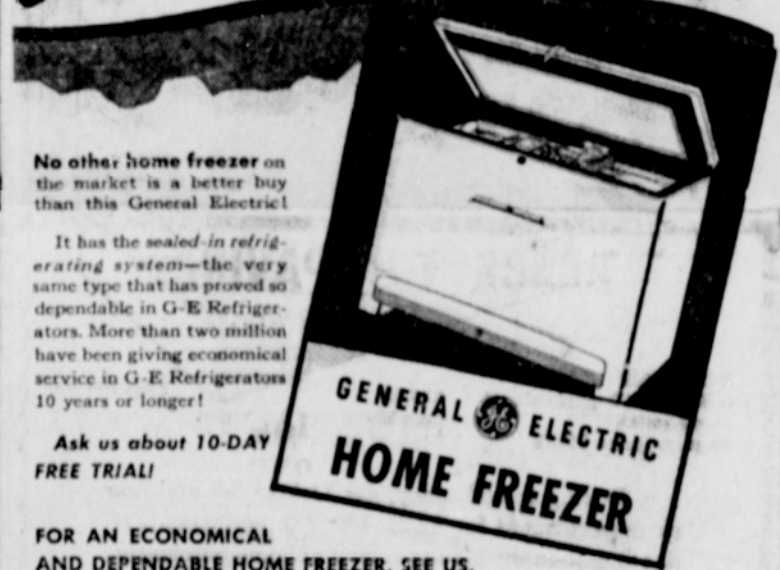
