

LUMBER OUTPUT UP

Operating conditions are gradually improving in the western lumber-producing states, but demand, prices and rate of production are still unsettled, according to the March survey report received here today by Fred Harris, an official of Western Forest Industries Association. Each month this organization makes a study of operating and marketing conditions among the independent loggers, sawmill operators and remanufacturers comprising its membership in the western states.

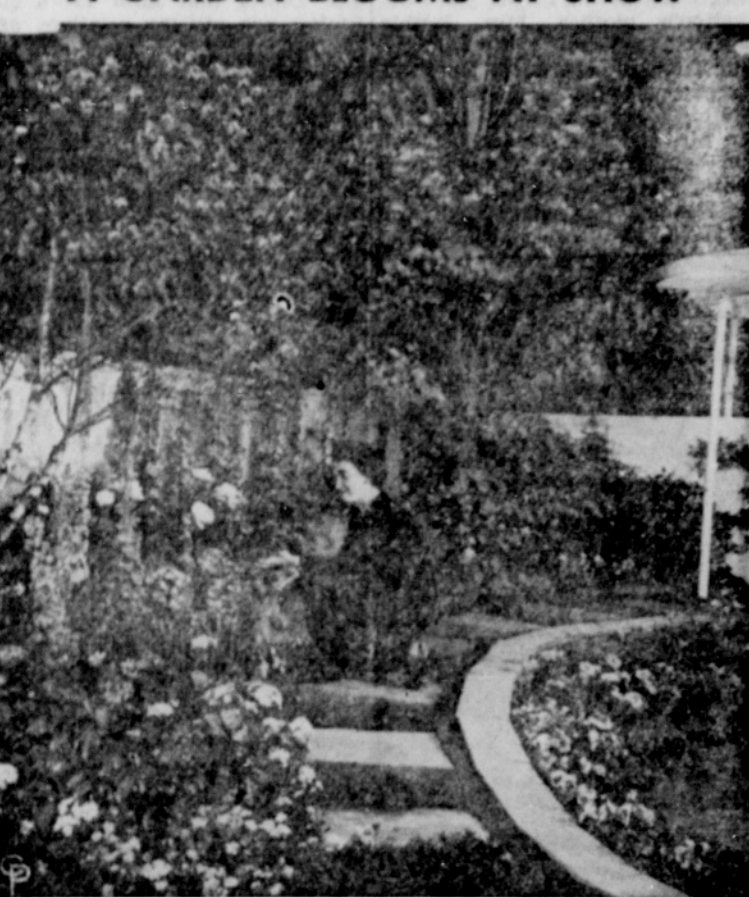

Straw for New Water Pipes

Cover newly laid water pipes with straw or hay the first winter, even though they may be installed below frost level. During the first winter after the water pipes are laid, the ground over the pipes will be loose. This permits the frost to go down below its normal level. A foot of hay or straw placed over the pipe line, particularly where it will not be covered with snow, can prevent any danger of damage by freezing.

Clean Milk Equipment

All equipment that comes into contact with milk should be rinsed with cool water immediately after use and then washed and sterilized.
