

Farm Women Make Big Saving From Furniture Repair

Savings to farm families resulting from home furnishings workshops held in the state during the past year amount to \$17,137, estimates Mrs. Myrtle Carter, O. S. C. extension specialist in clothing and home furnishings.

The sum represents the difference between the cost of articles constructed or renovated and the value of professionally built or repaired items, Mrs. Carter explains.

Instruction in home furnishings has been in demand during the past year due to the high cost of new home furnishings. Workshops were carried out on slip covering, upholstery, furniture refinishing and related subjects.

Twenty-two workshops trained 117 lay project leaders in this type of work.

A total of 414 groups representing close to 10,000 home economics extension unit members were enrolled in home furnishings projects, Mrs. Carter reports. More than 11,000 persons indicated they were assisted by various methods shown in this phase of the home economics extension program.

Mrs. Carter or local county extension agents in home economics conducted workshops in which 167 chairs were re-upholstered and repaired, 42 chairs were slip covered; 697 innerspring cushions were re-upholstered and 205 chairs were repaired as a result of information gained through workshops or unit demonstrations.

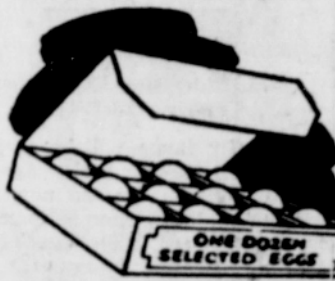
